The Chairman of the Council opened the 2016 Annual Assembly and invited members of the public to engage in the many displays that showcase the work of the Parish Council.

Chairman's Annual Report Councillor Joe Tray

The Parish Council has had a very busy and productive year. The Clerk to the Council with the assistance of the Deputy Clerk has been leading a new team in both democratic services and the Leisure Centre, ensuring the balance of job roles and skills meet the needs of the service.

The Democratic Team includes the Clerk, Tracy Predeth who joined us in 2014, Georgina Morgan-Denn (Deputy Clerk), Angela Lovering (Facilities Officer), Jodie Smart (Administration Officer) with Sandra Kelly and Emma Freemantle our Finance Officers.

We have also recruited key members to the team, namely David Boase, Senior Parks and Open Spaces Officer. David has also been a keen supporter of the 'Clean for the Queen' initiative where a series of litter picking events are taking place across the Parish.

Johanna Edwards is our new Events and Hospitality Officer. Jo is overseeing the business continuity and development for the Council and supporting the smooth running of our corporate functions and wedding packages.

Chris Mathews was appointed as Head Chef in July and caters for meals at Grange Leisure and over 280 school meals a day for Grange Junior and Infants schools. A special thanks goes to Chris and members of his team and family for giving up their Christmas day to provide a free Christmas lunch to those that are on their own at Christmas.

Dan Martin was promoted to Sports Development Officer and since then we have seen the introduction of sports development for all sectors of the community. Dan is overseeing the consultation on development of Meadowcroft in Upper Stratton so that the building is more connected to the sport that takes place. Our thanks go to the pupils of Stratton Education who have assisted in painting the interior of the sports pavilion.

Anne Harris and Gary Turland our Senior Fitness Instructors, have turned the fitness element of Grange Leisure around so that it is more inclusive to all. They work in partnership with the local surgery providing steps to health, GP referrals and promoting a healthy lifestyle to all. The gym is also very popular with sporting athletes but at the same time it is a welcome home for youths and the older generation.

The Grange Bar is managed by Mark Beazley and it has gone through elements of change since it is no longer a members only bar. There has been more entertainment provided to ensure that it caters for a cross spectrum of users. The bar shows as much sport as possible and we hold a very popular meat draw and quiz nights, as well as Rock and Roll Bingo, open mic nights and have local bands and discos.

The Council also thanks our support staff, too many to name as we employ 83 members of staff but each and every one is an important part of the team.

What does the Stratton St Margaret Parish **Council** do for its residents?

- The Council holds 68 meetings a year to ensure the smooth running of the parish, Statutory notices, agendas and minutes are provided for each meeting. Public are welcome to all meetings of the Council and The Committees, and public participation is encouraged to ensure that the voices of our residents are heard.
- The Council lobbies our principle authorities and Members of Parliament on key legislation to ensure the best result for our residents. For example, we undertook a Parish Poll on the transfer of services from the Borough Council to the Parish Council.
- Supports community groups by grant funding.
- Supports a Community Library at Grange Leisure.
- Working towards the return of a Post Office at Stratton St Margaret.
- Works in partnership with local Schools, Libraries and
- It provides an interactive website, Facebook, Instagram and Twitter pages, ensuring that residents and those further afield can keep up to date and are regularly informed of the activities of the Council.
- Produces newsletters, posters and leaflets throughout the year.

- It provides a number of public events, such as the popular Stratton Festival, Stratton Stroll and Christmas Extravaganza.
- It supports the Chairman's Charities, this year being Prospect Hospice and has raised nearly £2,000.
- Numerous consultation events with residents engaging them in decision making.
- Neighbourhood Planning.
- Continual improvement programme of Council owned property.
- Working towards 'Gold' Council award scheme and 'Quest' leisure industry award.
- Adopted the General Power of Competence which permits the Council to trade, however there are still legislative restraints which have to be adhered to.

Members of the Council give up their time to serve as Parish Councillors to engage with their community in a positive and proactive way. Parish Councillors are the first tier of local government and are the 'grass routes' to assist and help support the needs of its community.

Property Management Committee (Chair: Councillor John Foley)

The Property Management Committee is responsible for strategically developing and protecting the properties it owns across the Parish of Stratton St Margaret. This includes the Grange Leisure and Community Centre, the Meadowcroft Community Centre, the Meadowcroft Sports Pavilion, Dorcan Way Recreation Ground and Sports Pavilion and the Chapel at Green Road Cemetery.

The Chapel at Green Road cemetery was transferred to the Parish Council a number dedicated gym entrance and wedding of years ago. The Chapel was originally built in 1869 by Nonconformists. Currently customers' experience when visiting the Chapel is not being used to its full potential and the Council continues to pursue funding avenues which, when successful, will assist with making this unique space functional again.

The Parish Council Offices moved to Grange Leisure Centre in 2014. A centralised approach for the Centre and Parish Council's administrative and facilities July we saw nearly 5,000 festival goers functions now exist to deliver value for money and consistency of operation.

The Leisure Centre will see improvement works continue, most recently the redecoration of our Stratton Suite. The Council is confident that it will soon be tapping into a new business stream and offering conference and seminar facilities to an extensive programme of functions that include weddings, parties, concerts, exhibitions and Christmas nights.

Further improvement works could see a entrance which will both assist with our Centre.

Stratton Festival and our Stratton Stroll are events that are very popular for the whole of the Parish. The Council's main objective is to stage something annually which would bring the community together and celebrate all that is great about being in Stratton St Margaret. Last attend our Festival and Stroll which takes place at our Leisure Centre.

We also held our first Christmas Day community lunch last year which attracted about 40 people, who may otherwise have been on their own. The food was donated by our suppliers which the Council uses throughout the year and the local Churches helped to serve the lunch on the day. Each guest received a wrapped Christmas present, which were

very generously donated by members of the public, staff, their friends and families and local businesses. We also received donations of cash which went towards the transport costs for many of the guests. The Council is planning to hold another lunch this December too.

The Grange Gym at our Leisure Centre has gone from strength to strength in 2015, proving to be more popular than ever. We have a fantastic following and despite our growing popularity, we are still able to maintain a personal and community atmosphere.

The Leisure Centre continues to work with a wide range of customers from all abilities from the beginner, those going through rehabilitation following an injury to professional athletes. We have had the pleasure and honour of training Professional Boxing Champion Kelvin Young, and Professional Mixed Martial Arts Champions, Alex Brunnen and Phil Wells.

Finance & General Purpose Committee

Financial Report for year ending 31 March 2015

The 2015–2016 budget for the Leisure Centre and Parish Council combined was – Expenditure: £1,793,671 and Income: £1,693,257 which includes the Precept of £783,458. The 2016–17 Precept has been set at £897,747 being a 12% increase which equates to an additional £14.18 per annum per household or £1.18 per month. The budget is split between the following areas of the business and all areas performed well in 2015–16 against their targets.

Public Question Time

The following questions were put to the Chairman by members of the public.

Will the Parish Council be supporting the local libraries?

The potential closure of local libraries is a subject that is already being discussed by the Parish Council and we intend to support that libraries stay open in any way that we can.

Will there be a provision for a Post Office within the Parish Council as the local Post Office in Lower Stratton has recently closed?

This is a matter that is currently under investigation by the Parish Council.

In the last newsletter there was mention of extending the Parish Boundaries. Can you tell me what the Pros and Cons of doing so would be?

The Swindon Borough Council would like to parish the whole of Swindon. We have put forward a speculative idea of possibly extending our boundary. Stratton St Margaret Parish Council is one of the largest Local Authorities in the Borough of Swindon and employs a number of qualified and experienced staff and has a team of established Parish Councillors with a range of skills that would embrace the challenges that are ahead.

I would like to express my support for the number 20 bus, I suggest a link to the number 7 bus.

This is also something that is currently being discussed and investigated by the Parish Council.

Planning & Highways Committee

(Chair: Councillor Teresa Page)

From May 2015 – April 2016 the Planning & Highways Committee have received approximately 135 planning applications. We objected to a few, most were passed by the Swindon Borough Council Officers. About 96% of plans submitted to the Borough Council are passed by delegated powers by their Officers and do not go to their main Planning Committee, which sits once a month.

Recently the Parish Council turned down the request from UK Broadband Network Limited. They wanted to put a mast on our site at the Grange Leisure. After taking into account concerns from local residents and the Councillors' own concerns, we turned down the request and they withdrew it.

The Council has had a presentation regarding the installation of an Energy Centre at Keypoint and they in turn are holding public meetings. So far the Parish Council's Planning Committee has only received negative responses from the local residents.

We then have the Eastern Villages Development with the planned development of around 8,000 homes to the east of the A149 plus all that entails.

We also have planning applications for another 74 houses on the land to the rear of Kingsdown School and the Crosslink Centre.

On most developments within our Parish we can negotiate a Community Infrastructure Levy so that the developers will contribute a set amount of money towards projects being undertaken within the community, from assisting with highways improvements to refurbishing or providing new play equipment.

The Planning and Highways committee is also committed to assisting in the development of the Stratton St Margaret Neighbourhood Plan - a plan made by the community for the community and has legal weight. This presents an opportunity for our community to have a say over our future, allowing us to set out local planning policies and strategies for the next 10 to 15 years. The plan will give residents of Stratton St Margaret Parish a strong influence over land use and when, where and what type of development can take place. The Plan covers all aspects of the community and is split into the categories which are led by our Officers.

Sport In The Community Dan Martin – Sports Development Officer

Stratton St Margaret Parish Council is striving to become the most inclusive when offering health and fitness to the local community.

Over the last year Dan Martin, Sports Development Officer has had the pleasure of coaching and motivating students with different challenges such as mobility and learning difficulties from Riverside School, Stratton Education, Marlborough House and Uplands School. Sport and fitness sessions such as skittles, football and basketball have been adapted to suit the needs of all participants to show that sport can be inclusive to all.

Walking football as well as walking netball sessions have been launched at Grange Leisure which have become very popular. Parkinsons Swindon have set up a walking football session which has helped individuals grow in confidence and movement which has left health practitioners amazed with improvements in fitness and mobility.

Walking Netball has also been introduced and is already very popular, it is a great form of exercise and social activity, the centre is now looking to host 'Back to Netball'.

Public consultations have taken place to look at the potential development of our sports facilities. Projects are progressing, it is possible that cricket could make a popular return back to Meadowcroft.

More recently we have formed fantastic partnerships with Wiltshire and Swindon Sport, Swindon Sports Forum, Run England, England netball, SEQOL, and England and Wales Cricket Board, which looks to set the Parish Council up for exciting times moving forward.

Stratton Juniors have completed their first full season of football at Meadowcroft which has seen up to 200 children playing football matches within the Parish Council.

Allotments

At this moment in time we are making excellent progress in reducing the waiting list for Allotment plots. At the start of the year, the lists stood at 10 for St Philips and 24 for White Hart, but due to a major effort to restore full use of every plot, these numbers are quickly decreasing.

New agreements have been issued to all allotment holders, records have been updated, and the feedback we have received for this has been extremely positive. There will be an Allotment competition and allotment holders have received that notice with all of the information.

White Hart Allotment Society has now been given the space needed to develop a community hub.

Open Spaces

We continue to monitor Claridges Pond. In the past, two generators were stolen. The Environmental Agency recently carried out a survey of the pond, and is due to report back to us very soon. Clean for the Queen was very successful

and litter picking continues. This is the Parish residents' opportunity to come forward and volunteer. Details are on our website. Our Play Areas are maintained to a very high standard and I thank the Grounds Team for all they do.
