

Pidgeon House Farm - Timeline

The farm covered 70 acres. Rising to 75 acres by 1850

1786

An Enclosure Award was granted to John Hitchmore.

1809

A Sale by Auction Notice appeared in the Public Ledger and Daily Advertiser on the 8th of March 1809

1829

A Sale by Auction Notice appeared in the Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette on the 24th of September 1829

1841

The Census returns show Ralph Wilkins as farmer here.

1846-1847

About this time four two-bedroom cottages were built and sold at auction in 1847 according to the Reading Mercury dated 24th April 1847.

1850

The property had increased to 75 acres and including the brewery is sold as part of the estate of Mr. William Large.

A further sale was held later in the year Lot 1 being a messuage and compact brewery. Lot 2 The Farmhouse and surrounding buildings and orchard 2 acres. Lot 3 comprised of a 6-bedroom Dwelling house with walled garden and orchard. As recorded in the Devizes & Wiltshire Gazette on the 19th September 1850.

1851-1861

The Census returns show Ralph Wilkins as farmer here.

1871

The census returns show widow Jane Wilkins as having taken on the farm and farming 70 acres

1880

Jane Williams is farming according to Kellys Directory. (Possible mis transcript of Wilkins)

1881

The census returns show widow Jane Wilkins as farming 70 acres

1886

The owner of the property was Thomas Day

1890

The North Wilts Directory shows the farmer as Fuller Fyson.

John Penney of Stratton is recorded in a local newspaper as having been charged with unlawfully wounding a mare in foal. The case was dismissed as being accidental.

1893

Kellys Directory Names Walter Henry Jukes as farmer here

1896

The owners are named as W. H. Day and Levi Morse.

1898

Kellys Directory Names Walter Henry Jukes as farmer here

1901

The Census shows Walter H. Jukes as farmer here

1903

Kellys Directory Names Walter Henry Jukes as farmer here

1906

Walter Henry Jukes was charged with arson and was sent to prison. Reports were in the Citizen dated 16th March and 9th June 1906

1910

Edgar Ellison was in charge (farming 81 Acres)

1911

The Census records Edgar Ellison as being in charge here

1928

Swindon Directory records William George & Maud Russell as living here. Willia is listed as a cattle dealer

1930

Kellys Directory records William George & Maud Russell as living here. Willia is listed as a cattle dealer

1936

The Electoral Roll record records William George & Maud Russell as living here. Willia is listed as a cattle dealer

1939

The 1939 Register records William George & Maud Russell as living here. Willia is listed as a cattle dealer.

1948

Swindon Street Directory has A. Large and A. L. Richardson in occupation.

1951

Swindon Street directory records the occupants as being W. B. Tompkins and Gladys Gibble.

1953

A Mr. Tomkins was advertising two blocks of 108 Clyde-built easy clean laying cages for sale in the Wiltshire Times dated 8th of August 1953

The current postal code for the property is SN3 4ST
