Mr Richard Green, young English dairy farmer, told Mr Justice Bennett in the Chancery Court recently that he had 26 cows and worked his sixty-acre farm alone, because he could not obtain help; munitions and aircraft factories had taken the farm hands. Mr Green, who lives at the Homestead, Sutton Mandeville, about 11 miles from Salisbury, appeared to answer an application by his former partner, Mr A. C. Truscott, for the appointment of a receiver. When it was suggested that a chartered accountant should be appointed receiver and manager, Mr Justice Bennett asked: "Can he go and milk the cows every morning? Or has he a clerk who is a skilled farm manager?" Granting an order for the appointment of a receiver, the judge directed that Mr Green should be employed on the farm.
