Amelia Payne

Amelia Payne was born around 1817/1818 (possibly 13th May, 1817) at Sutton Mandeville, Wiltshire, England to parents Stephen & Mary Payne (nee Seward).

Amelia Payne had a son with Ryall Pegham in 1840 – Job Payne. He was baptized at Sutton Mandeville on 7th June, 1840 with only his mother listed – Amelia Payne.

The 1841 England Census recorded Amelia Payne as 20 year old living at Long's, Sutton Mandeville. Also included in the household were – Stephen Pain (aged 60), Mary Pain (aged 60), Ruben Pain (aged 30), Mary Pain (aged 25), then Amelia Pain, Stephen Pain (aged 2), Job Pain (aged 1) & Jane Pain (aged 3 months). (Note- adults' ages were rounded up or down to the nearest 5 years in the 1841 Census).

Amelia Payne married Charles Batten (father's name Benjamin Batten) on 26th October, 1848 at Everleigh, Devizes, Wiltshire. (Charles Batten was born at Hungerford, Berkshire – possibly 31st May, 1811).

The 1851 England Census recorded Amelia Batten as a 38 year old married woman (born Sutton Mandeville) living with her husband & 2 children at Everleigh, Wiltshire. Her husband was listed as Charles Batten (Agricultural Labourer, aged 40, born Berkshire) & her children were listed as Edwin Batten (aged 2, born Everleigh) & Job (Pain) Batten (aged 11, born Sutton Mandeville). Job was Amelia's son with Ryall Pegham.

Charles & Amelia Batten embarked for Australia with their children – Edwin & Job (Job was Charles' stepson) in 1854. They arrived in New South Wales, Australia on 7th September, 1854 having arrived aboard the vessel *Tantivy*. Details given were – Charles Batten – aged 42, Farm Labourer, born Hungerford Berkshire, parents – Benjamin & Hannah Batten – residing at Newton, Hampshire. Amelia Batten – see above. Job (Payne) Batten – aged 14, Farm Labourer, born Sutton Mandeville, parents – Ryall Pegham – dead & Amelia – on Board. Edwin Batten – aged 5, born Everleigh, Wiltshire, parents – on board.

A birth was registered in the district of Goulburn, New South Wales in 1864 for Amelia Batten, the daughter of Charles & Amelia Batten (nee Payne). (Her birth may have been 29th December, 1863 at Longreach, Goulburn, NSW).

A death was registered in Goulburn, NSW in 1878 for Charles Batten (father's name Benjamin Batten). Charles Batten died at the age of 66 years at Longreach, Goulburn, NSW on 12th April, 1878.

Amelia Batten married George Meadley in Goulburn, New South Wales, Australia in 1880. They had married on 31st January, 1880.

A death was registered in Goulburn, NSW in 1897 for Amelia Medley (parents Stephen and Mary). Amelia Meadley (nee Payne, formerly Batten) died at the age of 79 on 13th February, 1897.
