Newspaper Reports

Isaac YEATS June, 1837

Mr Whitmarsh (also) held an inquest on Thursday, at Sutton Mandeville, on the body of Isaac Yeats. Deceased was seen driving a timer-carriage on Tuesday afternoon in the above parish, and in an hour afterwards was found lying against the bank, with the whip in his hand, and quite dead. The horses were standing still by his side. Deceased had been subject to fits, and it appeared that he had died from an attack of that malady.

Verdict, "Visitation of God."
