ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD

WHEREAS, some Person or Persons did, in the night of Thursday, the 13th, or early in the morning of Friday, the 14th day of November instant, maliciously and feloniously SET FIRE TO BURN, and DESTROY a certain BARN, called Pigeon-House Barn, situate at Sutton Mandeville, in the county of Wilts, the property of William Wyndham, Esq., of Dinton; and also a STACK of HAY, and a considerable quantity of unthrashed Barley, Beans, and Clover seed, in and near thereto, the property of Mr Morgan Blandford, of Sutton Mandeville aforesaid.

The above Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS is hereby offered to any person or persons who will give such information as may lead to the conviction of the offender or offenders, such Reward to be paid on such conviction taking place, at the Office of Mr Charles Nicholson, Barford, near Salisbury.

And if the INFORMATION be given by an ACCOMPLICE or ACCOMPLICES, he, she, or they will be entitled to the same Reward, and every endeavor will be used to obtain for him, her, or them a FREE PARDON. – Barford, Nov. 15, 1834 [7975]
