Lodge to Sutton Veny House

Location – Norton Road, Sutton Veny, Wiltshire (south side)

Grade II - Listed 1 July, 1986

Lodge. Dated 1856 on pediment, for Joseph Everett.

Rubble stone and limestone ashlar, Welsh slate, ashlar stack. Single storey. Tuscan distyle in antis portico facing drive to house; 4-panelled door in moulded architrave with 12-pane sash in moulded architrave either side, rusticated chamfered quoins, pediment over with Everett family crest and date. Left return has two 12-pane sashes in moulded architraves, one 2-light casement to flat-headed dormer. To right return is single storey wing with two sashes. Rear gable has blind lunette to pediment, attached lean-to extension. Attached to right are ashlar dwarf walls with cast-iron spearhead railings to three square ashlar gate piers with ball finials with spearhead double gates. Very similar to contemporary lodge on Bishopstrow Road (q.v.).
