Every year on Anzac morning, the children of the tiny Wiltshire village of Sutton Veny, on Salisbury Plain, place flowers on the graves of the many Australians who were buried in the churchyard in World War I. Every year the rector holds an Anzac service. For the first time this year, so Mrs M. Mears, of Frewville, tells me, the service, will be broadcast – from the BBC at 6 a.m. tomorrow. In announcing the innovation, the rector wrote: “The borders have been planted with pinks and roses and I hope there will be a blaze of color this year.”
