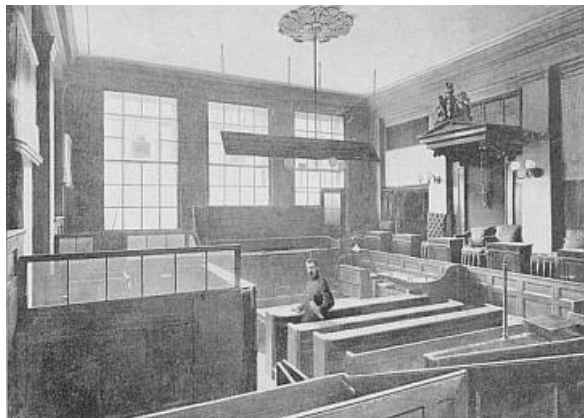

Wiltshire Quarter Sessions The Quarter Session for Wiltshire was held at Warminster, yesterday, before Lord Bath (chairman) and other magistrates. John Williams, a labourer, was sentenced to four months for breaking a window and stealing 44 gold rings at Swindon on April 9. **Western Daily Press, Wednesday, 1 July 1914**

Two conscientious objectors, who were remanded for 14 days in order that they might submit to a medical examination, were at Bath yesterday sent to prison for refusing to do so. They were Jesse Albert Titcombe of Swindon, and Reginald Vivian Sawyers of Seend near Melksham. **Western Daily Press, Wednesday, 24 June 1942**
