

Tísbury 1800-1849

1818

On Tuesday the 3rd inst. died at her son's seat, Hedingham Castle, Mrs. Majendie, relict of the late Dr. Majendie, Canon of Windsor, Prebendary of Worcester and of this Cathedral, Salisbury and Preceptor to the Queen; mother of the Bishop of Bangor, and aunt to Dr. Prevost, Vicar of Tisbury.
