



Shot Through Bathroom Window

Alarming Experience

Mr. Ralph Davis, a G.W.R. goods clerk, who lives with his brother-in-law, Mr. Albert Taylor, at 66 Bradley Road, had an alarming experience on Thursday night, and a providential escape from death or serious injury.

Just before retiring to bed at about 11.30 p.m., Mr. Davis went into the bathroom - which was on the ground floor - to clean his teeth. He had just done so and was putting his tooth-brush away when the glass of the bathroom window was shattered and a bullet passed the exact spot where Mr. Davis had been standing a few seconds earlier, pierced the geyser, and then travelled some distance, falling in an adjoining room.

Mr. Davis is suffering considerably from shock. Mr. Albert Taylor was fire-watching at Messrs. Foster Bros. at the time, but Mrs. Taylor was at home and heard the crash. Neighbours also heard gun-shots fired.

The police have taken possession of the bullet and are investigating the strange affair.
