7th Wiltshire Regiment; Private. France. Died in hospital at Portsmouth, March 19th, 1916

JEFFERIES, HARRY

12 YERBURY STREET

6th Wiltshire Regiment; Private. France. Died in hospital at Birmingham, June 4th, 1918

JENKINS, WILLIE

43 CASTLE STREET

Northumberland Fusliers; Captain; Mons Star. France and Dardanelles. Killed at Suvla Bay.

JONES, HUBERT LAWRENCE

6 VICTORIA ROAD.

R.E. Sapper; Mons Star. France. He went to France in August, and was killed instantaneously by a shell on May 2nd, 1915, at Ypres, at the age of 21 years.

JONES, WILLIAM GEORGE

6 VICTORIA ROAD Kings Royal Fusliers; Private. France. Killed March 9th, 1918.



KEEVIL, JOHN FRANCIS

LLOYDS BANK, FORE STREET

R.G.A. Gunner, France. Killed in action, December 19th, 1916

KING, HOWARD

ADCROFT VILLA, PROSPECT PLACE

R.N. Chief Motor Mechanic. Died February 7th, 1919, in Scotland, at the age of 37 years.

KNEE, MELVILLE VICTOR

ROSEBANK, GLOUCESTER ROAD

R.A.S.C., M.T. Company, Driver; East Africa. He saw service in the fever ridden districts of German East Africa, but eventually was laid aside by illness, and spent five months in a Durban hospital suffering from enteric fever and dysentery, After several months convalescence he returned to duty. He died on July 22nd, 1917, suffering from pneumonia, at Robert's Heights, Pretoria, at the age of 25 years.

KNIGHT, RICHARD THOMAS

6 KEMP'S BUILDINGS, MORTIMER STREET

3rd Wiltshire Regiment, Private. France. Killed January 2nd, 1915

KNOWLER, HERBERT CECIL CASE

16 Upper Broad Street

R.F.A. transferred to Somerset Light Infantry; Private. Mesopotamia. Wounded in Mesopotamia. Died at the British General Hospital, Baghdad, on the 3oth June, 1918 at the age of 24 years.



LANE, ALBERT VICTOR

18, INNOX ROAD

3rd Wiltshire Regiment; Private. Wounded and missing since November 1917.

LAND, FREDERICK

38 Shails Lane

R.E. Sapper. France. Killed October 17th 1918, while removing a German mine, at the age of 34 years.

LERTORA, L.

19. INNOX ROAD.

3rd Dragoon Guards; Trooper; Mons Star. France. Killed at Ypres, November 13th, 1914, after being in action only a short but very hard time, and was praised by his officer for his courage and pluck only the day before he was killed.

LESTER, WALTER GEORGE

19 New Road

1st Wiltshire Regiment; Company Sergeant Major; D.C.M., M.C., France. Was the first Trowbridge man to be honoured in the war, being mentioned in Sir John French's first list of dispatches, and awarded the D.C.M. for splendid work in the Retreat from Mons. He was killed in action on July 9th, 1916, at the age of 37 years.

LITTLE, ALBERT ERNEST

6 Prospect place

1st Wiltshire Regiment; lance corporal; Mons Star. France. Killed October 15th, 1914, at Mons.

LOXLEY, HARRY

3 Surrey Place

1/4th Wiltshire Regiment; Private. India and Palestine. Killed November 2nd, 1917, in Palestine.

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LOXLEY, JOHN

29 ASHTON STREET

826 A.E. Labour Corps; Private. France. Died from haemorrhage in the 26th General Hospital, Etaples, on November 2nd., 1918.

Westbourne Gardens

1/4th Wiltshire Regiment; Sergeant. Palestine. Killed November 7th, 1917, at Gaza.

MAGUIRE, BRIAN WILFRED FRANCIS

55 Bradley Road

1st King's Royal Rifle Corps; Private. France. Killed in action in Delville Wood, July 27th, 1916 at the age of 19 years.

MAILL, A.W.

5 Kemp's Buildings

1st Wiltshire Regiment; private. France. Wounded three times. Killed July 29th, 1917.

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MARMONT, CHARLES EDWARD

14, LOWER ALMA STREET

11th Gloucester Regiment; Private. France. Dardanelles and Mesopotamia. In relief of Kut. Killed February 10th, 1917.

MARSHMAN, WILLIAM GEORGE

114 LOWER STUDLEY

6th R.N. Division; Able seaman. France. Wounded on Christmas Day, 1917. After treatment in English hospitals he returned to France in August 1918 and met his death in action at Guinchy, on September 3rd, 1918 at the age of 21 years.

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MARSHMAN, H.

49 Islington

Welsh Regiment; Private. Gallipoli. Killed in landing at Suvla Bay.

MARTIN, GEORGE DUNN

1/4th Wiltshire Regiment; Private. India and Palestine. Killed in Palestine.

King's Royal Rifle Corps; Rifleman. Fce. Killed in action on February 27th, 1917 at Combles.

14th Canadians; Private. France. Killed June 12th, 1916, at Zelebeck.

MATTHEWS, ROBERT JOHN

THE COTTAGE, HILPERTON ROAD

2/4th Norfolk Regiment, attached M.G.C; Lieutenant. France. Wounded April, 1918, at Merville. Died November 2nd, 1918, in Grantham Military Hospital, suffering with pneumonia, at the age of 21 years.

6, BARNETT'S COURT, MORTIMER STREET

1st Wiltshire Regiment; Sergeant. France. Wounded at Festubert. Accidentally killed at bombing demonstration at Weymouth, September 24th, 1917.

Wiltshire Regiment; Private. Mons Star. France. Killed October 1914.

1st Wiltshire Regiment; Private; Mons Star. France. Killed in retreat from Mons.

1st Wiltshire Regiment; Private. France. Died January 11th, 1919, at Sutton.

ALTHORPE HOUSE, BARNES, LONDON, S.W.

4tR.H.A. Lieutenant; Mons Star, France. Killed in Mons Retreat.

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MUNDY, VICTOR HOWARD

1 West Street

12/4th Wiltshire Regiment; Private. India. Died of pneumonia in King George War Hospital, Poona, February 20th, 1919.
