The bride was given away by her father and the Rev. L. K. Fletcher, M.A., conducted the service. The choir was present and the school children were also very much in evidence, a number of former scholars also being present.

Miss Daisy Tucker played suitable music on the organ, and as the bridal pair left the church they were received with showers of confetti, the children also strewing flowers along the path. Mr. and Mrs. Elloway afterwards left for a brief sojourn in Bournemouth before the bridegroom re-joins his regiment at the Front.
