Ashley	George	Aged 39, Labourer, charged with assaulting Emily Florence Hibbert, 11 years of age, at Upton Lovell. <i>Outcome:</i> Two months hard labour	<i>Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette</i> 18 October, 1888
Roberts	John	A tramp, charged with stealing a pair of boots, value 5s., the property of Alfred Rowe, of Upton Lovell. <i>Outcome:</i> One month's imprisonment	<i>Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette</i> 5 September, 1889
