Stanley Whatley

Stanley Whatley was born on 30 September, 1895. A birth for Stanley Whatley was registered in the December quarter, 1895 in the district of Warminster, Wiltshire.

The 1901 England Census recorded Stanley Whatley as a 4 year old living with his grandparents at High Street, Upton Lovell, Wiltshire. His grandparents were listed as William Whatley (Carrier, aged 65) & Elizabeth Whatley (aged 61).

The 1911 England Census recorded Stanley Whatley as 15 year old General Labourer living at Winterbourne Stoke in a 3 roomed dwelling with his father & older Brother – Fread Whatly (Shepherd, married, aged 45) & Fread Harrold Whatly (Shepherd, aged 19). Stanley's father stated that he had been married for 21 years & had 5 children, one child deceased.

Stanley Whatley arrived at the port of New York on 3 January, 1923 aboard the SS *Majestic*.

Stanley Whatley married his wife Johanna on 3 August, 1929.

The 1930 United States Federal Census recorded Stanley Whatley as a 34 year old Carpenter living at East 78 Street, New York with his wife – Johanna (aged 26) & their daughter Loraine M. (aged 3 ½). Johanna's parents had both been born in Italy.

The 1940 United States Federal Census recorded Stanley Whatley as a 45 year old with no occupation listed (but having worked 54 hours in the week listed) living at East 78 Street, New York with his wife – Johanna (Superintendent of Apt. House, aged 33) & their daughter Lorraine (aged 14)

The U.S. World War 2 Draft Registration card for Stanley Whatley records his date of birth as 30 September, 1895 & born at Upton Lovell, Wiltshire. Stanley Whatley was aged 46 & lived at 446 East 78 Street, New York. He was employed at Edgar Ellinger Realty Co. at 325 East 79 Street, New York. (The U.S. WW2 Registration card was conducted on 27 April, 1942 and registered men who were born on or between 28 April, 1877 & 16 February, 1897 – men between the ages of 45 & 64 who were not already in the military were required to complete their details. These are known as the "Fourth Registration" of "Old Man's Registration" & are currently the only group that is publically available.)
