In the Name of God Amen I Mary Pierce of Crookwood in the Parish of Urchfont in the County of Wilts Widow being of a sound and disposing Mind and Memory do make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament in manner following that is to say ffirst and Principally I commend my Soul to God who gave it And my Body I committ to the Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executrix hereafter named And as to my Worldly Estate I dispose thereof as followeth I give to my two Granddaughters Mary and Jane Anstie ffifty pounds a piece to be paid them respectively as they attain their respective Ages of ffour and twenty years And if either or both of them dye before they attain such their Ages That the Legacy given to her or them soe dying shall remain to my Executrix Also I give to my Daughter Mary Applegarth One hundred pounds to be paid her in Two Months after my Decease Also I give to my Grandaughter Anne Gaisford One hundred pounds to be paid her Age of ffour and Twenty years together with lawfull Interest for the same

from my decease towards Her Maintenance And if She dye before She attain such Age That then the said Hundred Pounds shall remain to my Executrix Also in Case my Son in Law John Anstie's Circumstances shall at any time happen to be soe low that his now Wife and my Daughter Mirabill be reduced to want That then and from thenceforth I give my Son in Law Matthew Loader of Thame in the County of Oxon and to my Cousin William Pierce of Wedhampton in the Parish of Urchfont and to the Survivor of them and to the Executors and Administrators of the Survivor of them One Annuity or clear Yearly Rent Charge of Ten Pounds a year to be paid half yearly for the Terme of the life of my said Daughter Mirabill and upon Trust that the same be by them applyed to her sole and seperate Use and Maintenance exclusive of her Husband And I doe Charge my Estate with the Payment of it Also I give to my Trustees a Broad Peice of Gold each And to each of them a Gold Ring of a Guinea value All the Rest and Residue of my Goods Chattles and Personall Estate I give to my Daughter Jane Loader whom I doe make sole Executrix of this my Will And I doe hereby revoke all former Wills by me made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the Eleventh day of february in the seaventh year of the Reign of our Sovereigne Lord George the Second by the Grace of God of Great Brittain ffrance and Ireland King Defender of the ffaith And in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seaven hundred and Thirty Three The marke of Mary Pierce
