

## Kelly's Directory Extract 1915 Wanborough



WANBOROUGH (a corruption of the old name Wodensburgh) is a parish on the old Roman road which runs through it, 3 miles north-east from Chiseldon station on the Midland and South Western Junction railway, and 5 south-east from Swindon by coach road, but only 31/2 by a bridle road, in the Northern division of the county, Kingsbridge hundred, Swindon and Highworth union, Swindon county court district and petty sessional division, rural deanery of Cricklade, archdeaconry of North Wilts and diocese of Bristol: it is divided into Upper and Lower Wanborough. The church of St Andrew is an ancient edifice of stone, in the Perpendicular and Decorated styles, consisting of chancel, nave of five bays, aisles, north and south porches and an embattled western tower with pinnacles, containing 5 bells: the church was restored in 1830, and variously repaired during the years 1880 to 1885 at a cost of nearly £500: there are sittings for 400 persons. The register dates from the year 1582. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £260, including 160 of glebe, with residence, in the gift of the Lord Chancellor, and held since 1911 by the Rev Cecil Foster Burgess. Here are Wesleyan and Primitive Methodist chapels. Charities amounting to £10, derived from land left in 1745 by the Hon William Stanley, with which are incorporated the charities of Margaret Brind and Mary Broadway, are distributed yearly. Fitzroy Pleydell Goddard esq. DL JP, the Dean and Chapter of Winchester and the President and Fellows of Magdalen College, Oxford, are lords of the manor and principal landowners. The soil is clay; subsoil, greensand and chalk. The chief crops are grass, wheat and beans. The area is 4,514 acres; rateable value £6,884; the opulation in 1911 was 764 in the civil and 776 in the ecclesiastical parish.

Nythe, 2 miles east from Swindon station, and Horpit, 4 miles east, are hamlets.

By Local Government Board Order 16,482, dated March 24, 1884, **Elm Court Farm** etc, was transferred from Wanborough to Little Hinton for civil purposes.

The School Board, formed in 1880, has been dissolved by the Education Act of 1902, & the school is now controlled by a board of managers; William Hinder, correspondent; Joseph Davis, attendance officer

Elementary School: built in 1832, at a cost of about £500, for 180 children; Herbert Brighton, master
