1805

On Saturday last was married, at Wilton, Mr. W. R. Blake, of Warminster, to Miss Sarah Stone of Wilton, **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, 28 October 1805**

1829

Married at Warminster, on Monday the 17th instant, Mr. James Lacock, of Codford Saint Mary, (gamekeeper to H. Biggs, Esq.), to Charlotte Dredge, of the former place. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 24 August, 1829**

1831

On Thursday last, aged 37, son, of Mr. James Wadley, Jnr. Of the Leigh Inn, Warminster. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 20 January 1831**

1839

October 8, at Codford Chapel, by the Rev. S. Penhall, Mr. W. Smith, gardener, to Miss Gardener, both of Warminster, Wilts. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, Thursday, 17 October, 1839**

1840

April 1st at East Knoyle, by the Rev. C. Wrottesley, Mr. Weeks of Warminster, to Kitty, the second daughter of Mr. John Snook, steward to H. Seymour, Esq. **Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 13 April 1840**

1842

May 18, 1842 at Bath, aged 73, John Hawksey Acherley, Esq., Barrister-at-Law, Quorum Commissioner in Bankruptcy for the districts of Warminster and Highworth, Wilts and senior Deputy Lieutenant of

Somerset. He was called to the bar at the Middle Temple, November 26, 1802. **Gentleman's Magazine, July 1842, Page 105**

1843

Married May 1, by the Rev. J. C. Stafford, at Dinton Church, Mr. Pontin, saddler, Warminster, to Ann, only daughter of Mr. Blake, saddler, of Teffont Magna, Wilts. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, Thursday, 4 May 1843**

1845

Died on the 21st inst at Warminster, aged 74, Mary widow of the Rev. Henry Goddard, Vicar of Longbridge Deverell and Castle Eaton in this county. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Saturday, 25 October 1845**

1846

Married, July 3, at St. Martin's Church, by the Rev W. W. Tatum, Mr. Peter Burton, of Alvediston, to Miss Charlotte Kellow, of Warminster. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Saturday, 11 July 1846**

Married, September 22, at Warminster, Wilts. by the Rev. A. Fane, Mr. Edward Foot, of Swindon, third son of the late Lieutenant R. Foot, of Blandford, Dorset, to Jane Maria, only daughter of the late Mr. Bastings, of Warminster. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 1 October 1846**

1847

Died, April 2, at Warminster, Miss Elizabeth Scard. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 3 April 1847**
