Warminster

Suicide;- At Warminster Common on Wednesday last, a man named **William Curtis**, about 70 years of age, a market gardener, put a period to his existence by hanging himself.

About noon on that day the deceased was found by his son in an outhouse joining his dwelling, suspended by a small rope from a rafter, and quite dead. On Thursday an inquest was held on the body, at the **Globe Inn**, before **George Sylvester, Esq.**, and a verdict of "Temporary Insanity" was returned. The deceased it would appear, had at times, been in a low desponding state of mind, especially a few years ago, but latterly there had been nothing in his conduct to lead to the supposition that he mediated self-destruction
