Westwood *1800-1849*

1812

On Wednesday George Hartup, late of Westwood, shearman, was apprehended and examined before Charles Bythesea, Esq. one of his Majesty's Justices of the Peace for this county, on a charge of having grossly abused Elizabeth Greenman, a child only three years old; and the horrid charge was so far substantiated, that the prisoner was fully committed for trial, and was on Thursday lodged in Fisherton Gaol. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 15 June 1812**

1833

Committed to the Old Bridewell, Devizes. Isaac Bray, for stealing 5 bundles of haulm or reed at Westwood. **Bath Chronicle and Weekly Gazette, 4 July 1833**

1839

Committed to the New Prison, Devizes Rachel Wheeler, for three weeks, for vagrancy at Westwood **Devizes & Wiltshire Gazette, 28 February 1839**

1843

Wilts Epiphany Sessions John Harris and William Gingell, charged on suspicion of stealing two tame rabbits, the property of Philip Cadby, at Westwood. Guilty: Harris, 10 years Transportation, Gingell, 4 months imprisonment. **Wiltshire Independent, 12 January 1843**
