

WILSFORD (or WILLESFORD), near Pewsey, is a village and parish, situated on the river Avon, about 6 miles southwest from Pewsey, 7 south-east from Devizes and 2½ south from Woodborough station on the Berks and Hants Extension branch of the Great Western railway, in the Eastern division of the county, Swanborough hundred, petty sessional division of Everleigh and Pewsey, Pewsey union, Devizes county court district, rural deanery of Potterne Enford portion, archdeaconry of Wilts and diocese of Salisbury. The church of St. Nicholas is an ancient stone structure in the Norman and Early English styles, consisting of chancel, nave, south porch and a square embattled western tower, with 5 bells and clock, and contains a pulpit dating from the early part of the 17th century: there are 150 sittings. The register dates from the year 1588. The living is a vicarage, yearly value £271, including 2 acres of glebe, with residence, in the gift of the Master of St. Nicholas' Hospital, Salisbury, and held since 1881 by the Rev. William Wrixon Keating M.A. of Trinity College, Dublin, who resides in the tithing of Manningford Bohun. Captain Wyndham, who is lord of the manor, and Mr. Hayward are the principal landowners. The soil and subsoil are green sand, with some clay. The chief crops are wheat. The area of Wilsford tithing is 1,692 acres; rateable value, £1,234, and a population of 305.

MANNINGFORD BOHUN is a hamlet and tithing, 2 miles north-east. Here is a chapel of ease, a stone building with chancel, nave, south porch and a western bell turret containing one bell : there are 130 sittings. There is also a Baptist chapel.
