Wílton 1800-1849

#### 1831

Salisbury Assizes. John Marsh was convicted of stealing two yards of cloth from the dwelling-house of John Newman, of Wilton. Death recorded. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 14 March 1831

#### 1834

Lost, at Wilton Fair, on the 12th September, or in the neighbourhood of Wilton - Four Lambs, marked S on the hip. Whoever has found the same, and will apply at the Printer's, shall have their Expenses paid; and whoever detains them after this notice, will be prosecuted. N.B. The above Lambs were purchased of Mr. John Snooke, of East Knoyle. Salisbury & Winchester Journal, Monday, 6 October 1834

## 1843

Wilts. Epiphany Sessions George Andrews and Joseph Hinton, for assaulting John Humphrey, Police Constable, in the execution of his duty, at Wilton, were ordered to enter into recognizances of £10 each to keep the peace. Wiltshire Independent, 12 January 1843

Wilts Epiphany Sessions John Ind and George Ind, charged with having stolen four lambs, the property of John Hopson, at Marlborough; further charged with having stolen one lamb, the property of Harry or Henry Hitchcock, at Wilton. Guilty: John Ind, 18 months imprisonment, George Ind, 10 years transportation. Wiltshire Independent, 12 January 1843

## 1845

Committed to Fisherton Gaol: Henry Shergold, of Pitton and Farley, and Edward Lawrence of Wilton, for twenty one days each, for poaching. John Garrett, of Pitton and Farley, for fourteen days, for poaching. Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Saturday, 20 December 1845

#### 1847

Committed to Fisherton Gaol George Kinsman, of Bulbridge, six weeks, for breaking windows. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 23 September 1847**
