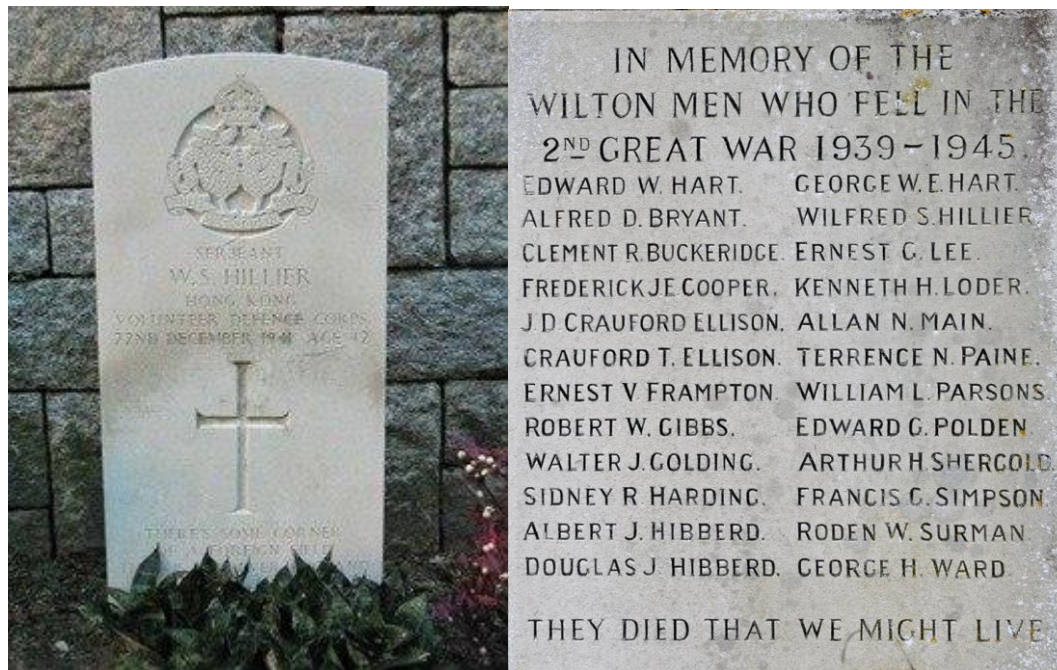

Other Significant Information										
His wife, 'Nellie' Middleton was born 21st November 1909 in Greenock, Scotland. She worked as a stenographer when they emigrated but recorded as a nurse when in the Prisoner of War camp. According to family lore she was forced to watch the execution a punishment often recorded amongst survivors of the Japanese Prisoner of War camps. Her family were connected to the sugar industry, her father a sugar boiler/refiner, her mother Agnes Currie MacFarlane was connected to the shipping MacFarlane shipping family.										
Wilfred departed London aboard the SS Mantua on 18th August 1922 destination Hong Kong. He was recorded as being a shop assistant aged 24 of 24 Russell Street, Wilton. He returned to England on 3rd May 1928 aged 29 and returned to Groveley Road, Wilton. He returned once more to Hong Kong on 14th September 1928 aboard the SS Kamala. Sometime between 1928 and 1933 Wilfred returned to the UK. He had met Nellie Middleton within this time period										
Wilfred and Nellie had married in Brighton in 1933 where Wilfred's brother was at St. Dunstan's home for the blind.										
Wilfred accompanied by Nellie travelled to Hong Kong from Southampton aboard the SS Rawalpindi on 3rd September 1933, recorded as a salesman and their destination was once more Hong Kong. Wilfred was killed and Nellie spent time in a Prisoner of War Camp after the Japanese invaded Hong Kong. Nellie nursed other prisoners in the camp.										
Nellie returned to England aboard the Empress of Australia arriving in Liverpool on 27th October 1945 and was reunited with the Hillier family at Grovely Road, Wilton. After a period of recovery with her in-laws it is believed she returned to her family in Greenock.
