World War II Roll of Honour

Student Nurse Cynthia Graham Walker

Cynthia Graham Walker was born in 1913, one of three daughters of Colonel and Mrs Graham Walker of Winsley. At the start of the Second World War she became a student nurse at St Thomas' Hospital, London. She died on 9th September 1940 when one of the hospital blocks received a direct hit during a bombing raid: 5 other female staff at the hospital died in the same raid. She is commemorated on the Winsley War Memorial and also on the Memorial in St Thomas Hospital. She is buried in Lambeth in London.

Sergeant Reginald Talbot Miller RAF 44 Squadron

Reginald Talbot Miller was born in Conkwell, Winsley, in 1921 and was the only child of his parents Mr & Mrs Talbot W Miller. He joined the RAF in 1936 and on completion of his training in 1939 he joined 44 Squadron and became a wireless operator/gunner. He died on 20th July 1940 when his plane was shot down by anti-aircraft fire and crashed into the sea. He is buried in Skagen, Denmark. He is commemorated on the Winsley War Memorial and his name is recorded in the Battle of Britain Chapel in Westminster Abbey

Corporal Norman Llewellyn Pocock R.A.A.F

Norman Llewellyn Pocock was born in 1914. He died 5th June 1945 and is buried in the churchyard of St Nicholas Church Winsley. He is commemorated on the Winsley War Memorial.
