

Kelly's Directory 1895

WINTERBOURNE GUNNER (or CHERBOROUGH, or UPPER WINTERBOURNE) is a parish and a village, in the Bourne Valley, 1½ south-west from Porton station on the London and South Western railway, 4½ north-east from Salisbury, and 4½ south from Amesbury, in the Southern division of the county, Alderbury Hundred, Salisbury and Amesbury petty sessional division, Amesbury union, Salisbury county court district, rural deanery of Amesbury (Alderbury portion), archdeaconry of Sarum and diocese of Salisbury.

The Bourne, a fine trout stream, flows through this parish.

The church of St Mary is a plain structure, built in the 12th century; it was somewhat injured by the Cromwellians, and was repaired in 1810; it has a chancel, nave, south porch and low square tower containing 2 bells; it was restored in 1885; there are 80 sittings. The register dates from the year 1573.

The living is a rectory, average tithe rent-charge £165, gross yearly value £178, net £130, including residence and 9 acres of glebe, in the gift of the Lord Chancellor, and held since 1889 by the Rev Edward Lewis Lloyd B.A. of Jesus College, Oxford.

Here is a Wesleyan chapel.

Tanner's charity of £12 11s yearly, is derived from £500 New 3¼ per cent. Bank Annuities, left in 1848 by Miss Jane Tanner to keep in good repair a monument erected to her memory in the churchyard, the residue to be distributed to the poor of the parishes of Winterbourne Earls and Winterbourne Gunner in fuel and clothing.

John Evans Esq. of Cheltenham, is lord of the manor and principal landowner.

The soil is chalk; subsoil, same. The chief crops are wheat, barley and roots. The area is 1,481 acres; rateable value £1,143.

The population in 1891 was 166.
