<b>Arrival Date</b>	1 <sup>st</sup> August 1855

<b>Remarks</b>	Richard complained about the cooks on the voyage out to New South Wales.  Richard travelled out with his wife (Sarah) and children William, Mary, Jane, Thomas, Jacob and Henry.

**OPC Note:** Richard, the son of Daniel and Alice Mathews, had been baptised at Woodborough on 28<sup>th</sup> November 1811.
