

Kellys Directory Extract 1867 Woodford



WOODFORD (MIDDLE, UPPER and LOWER)

Woodford is a parish, consisting of three villages, pleasantly situated on the west side of a valley through which flows the river Avon, in the Southern division of the county, hundred of Underditch, Amesbury Union, Salisbury county court district, diocese and archdeaconry of Salisbury, and rural deanery of Amesbury. MIDDLE WOODFORD is 5 miles south-by-west from Amesbury, and 41/2 miles north-west from Salisbury, UPPER WOODFORD is 51/2 miles from Salisbury, and LOWER WOODFORD, 4 miles. The church of All Saints consists of nave, north and south aisles, and chancel, and was rebuilt by subscription in 1845, with the exception of the square embattled tower: the chancel, with stained glass window, was built at the expense of Giles Loder, esq., who is the lay impropriator. The register dates from 1538, and is in good preservation. The living is a vicarage, incorporated with Wilsford, 3 miles north, yearly gross value £428, £128 of which is a grant by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the support of a curate for Wilsford, with vicarage house, rebuilt in 1832, in the gift of the Bishop of the diocese, held by the Rev. Robert Money Chatfield, M.A., of Trinity College, Cambridge. A National day and Sunday school was erected in 1832. In the parish is Heale House, formerly the residence of the Hyde family: in this house Charles II took refuge after his defeat at the battle of Worcester, previous to embarking for the Continent. Here was formerly a palace of the Bishops of Salisbury, of which no trace remains, excepting a few carved stones found by the present occupier of Court House farm, which stands on a part of the site. The Bishop of Salisbury (who is lord of the manor) and Robert Loder, esq., who owns the Heale estate, are chief landowners. The chief crops are wheat, barley and oats. In 1861 the population was 500; the area is 2,780 acres;
