

Letter from the Vicarage



For the next few days the flower shops, card shops and stationers will be full of hearts. Valentine's Day looms as I write!

Of course, the traditional shape of a heart is nothing like the real thing. I was talking today to someone who recently watched on a screen while a procedure was being carried out on his heart. What he saw was unrecognisable as the red 'heart shape' we all know and love. Today it is possible to control the heart with a pacemaker, to open arteries with stents — even to give someone a new heart.

'Thought for the day' last Friday was about a man who received a pace-maker which transformed his life. Within days of the operation he was out and about for the first time in months.

As the speaker said: "A new heart, a new life. A miracle."

On Valentine's Day it is not medicine or operations we think of, but rather what the heart has come to represent over the years.

Love, the Beatles told us, is all we need. When Jesus was asked to sum up the law he said there were only two commandments: First to love God with everything you have, and second to love your neighbour as you love yourself.

But to define love is not easy. It has to be more than a feeling; feelings are far too flimsy to be a foundation for love.

The original language of the Bible was Greek, and there are four words

for love in that language.

The first word is eros, love between the sexes. The famous statue in Piccadilly Circus is of Eros with his bow.

'Storgé' describes the love parents have for children and children for parents, it is a family thing.

'Philia' means friendship; similar to our word cherish. Philadelphia means the city of friendship.

Agapé is the final word, and the one Jesus used. The best definition I have heard of this love is 'to want the best for another person, regardless of the personal cost'. This is a love which is based not on emotion or passion but on will and resolve. With our rather soft view of love it seems impossible that anyone could really follow Jesus command to 'love your enemy'. But it is possible to want the best for your enemies whilst hating what they do - possible but not easy. It is at this point that we really need some external help. And that is precisely what Jesus promises us. He said that anyone who followed Him would receive God's Holy Spirit, the power of God Himself; something to make the heart strong and enable real love to flourish.

As the radio speaker said: "A new heart, a new life. A miracle."


Small bunches of flowers will be prepared beforehand for distribution in the service, and we warmly invite everybody to come along.

More about Easter...

We have two special events over Easter weekend, 3rd to 5th April, both in St Mary's, Potterne.



Good Friday at 1.45 pm the Wiltshire String Quartet will lead us in Haydn's Seven Last Words From The Cross.

The first public performance was on Good Friday, April 6, 1787, in Cádiz. The plan was for the

contemporary equivalent of a dramatic multi-media work, based on the seven phrases Christ spoke from the cross as recorded in the Bible. The potential for a profoundly moving spiritual experience was obvious to the composer, but even he was surprised by the popularity his music quickly achieved. Today we use beautiful music to help us enter in to the wonder of what Jesus has done for us all.



Easter Day there will be a sunrise service starting at 6.00am.

The service begins in darkness with the lighting of the new Paschal Candle. The light is then passed round the congregation, each of whom has a candle.

It was in the darkness of the first Easter Day some women went to the tomb of Jesus. There they met with the Light of the World, the one who cannot be overcome even by death. We trust that this Easter you will meet Him too, in a way which is real and relevant to you.

What's happening on the farm!

As I begin to write this article, I am drawn to the recent articles in the national press about a young lad called Harley Baxter a 22 year old farmer from Yorkshire. A few weeks ago his flock of 55 ewes shrank by 11. These ewes were all killed by a single loose dog. To Harley this was not just a few sheep, it was his livelihood and his passion. This heart wrenching story is a stark reminder that no matter what breed your dog is they all have that hunter instinct. So please keep your dogs on leads whilst walking footpaths where there are livestock.

On a much more cheerful note, our new barn is now completed and is full with cattle. They all seem very happy and contented in their new home. We finished laying the concrete in the barn a couple of weeks ago, however we wanted to wait for the lights to be fitted before we put the cattle in the barn. With all the lights on at the farm I have been told it looks like a Christmas tree!

With space for more cattle at the farm, we have been going to sales buying extra heifers. Father has been to Devon and Somerset. There are plans to go to Cheshire, Kent and Dorset buying. With so many sales being advertised we try to choose the sales where the cattle for sale are pedigree, because when it comes to selling them again it is generally the pedigree heifers that are fetching the higher prices.

With this prolonged period of dry weather I have been able to get out onto the fields to spread some manure. This will add long term fertiliser to the soil and I hope to see the benefits throughout this coming growing season. Just before we broke up for half term, four children from Year 5 were selected to attend Lavington School as part of the 'Able, Gifted & Talented' programme. The two boys & two girls met with children from other local primary schools and did some team building games, which included making an indoor cave. They worked on improving some of their athletic skills and enjoyed a game of netball & tag rugby. We are fortunate enough to work closely with both Lavington & Devizes secondary schools and the children benefit from sports coaching and training, as well as other shared opportunities throughout the year.

With the introduction of a new National Curriculum in September 2014, it is important to keep parents updated with the changes that are taking place within the school system. On Monday 9th February a second Parent Forum evening took place – this one concentrating on the changes in mathematics in particular. Also on the agenda was a discussion on what the school is doing to improve following its recent good Ofsted report.

27th January 2015

Philip Salaman chaired the meeting attended by 17 parishioners.

The following items were reported on:

The gates have been installed on ROW11. Thanks to all the volunteers who completed this task.

Wiltshire have still not completed their review of footpaths but have promised to do so in February.

A quote for£2,000 has been received for fencing the village field and it was agreed to accept and go ahead with the job.

The following issues were discussed:

MPC has asked the developers of Stoke Marsh Farm solar park to make a contribution to improving broadband access to Marston. SW Solar have agreed to a sum of £15,000. As this represents a considerable portion of the £25,000 required by Open Reach, it was agreed to go ahead with the project. Good Energy will be similarly approached. It is expected that high speed Broadband will reach Marston in approximately 9 months.

Wiltshire Highways have agreed to come and inspect the verges which have deteriorated this winter

MPC will support Worton Council's proposals to implement measures to restrict speeds. Owing to the spacing of road lights through Marston it is believed that a speed limit of 30mph should be adhered to. Wiltshire will be asked to provide appropriate signs.

MPC have agreed to give temporary permission for contractors parking outside Breach Cottage.

MPC agreed to donate £300 to The Village Hall and to make an annual donation of £150 to the Wiltshire Air Ambulance appeal.

Speed-watch update

During the most recent week of monitoring the speed of vehicles travelling through our village, our team monitored 121 vehicles travelling in excess of the 30mph speed limit during just 4 hour long sessions.

The fastest was travelling at 47mph and many others were also above 40mph.

The difference of a few miles per hour can mean the difference between life and death. The faster someone is driving, the less time they have to stop if something unexpected happens.

If you kill someone while speeding, you will have to live with the long-term emotional consequences.

Speed limits are there for a reason.

The facts:

Speed is one of the main factors in fatal road accidents In 2013, 3,064 people were killed or seriously injured in crashes where speed was a factor.

The risk of death is approximately four times higher when a pedestrian is hit at 40mph than at 30mph

Fatal accidents are four times as likely on rural roads as urban roads



The speed limit is a limit not a target

In some road conditions, including fog and rain and traffic flow, even driving at the speed limit could be too fast.

TOP HOMEOPATHIC REMEDIES FOR COLDS AND FLU

Aconite - Early stages of colds, fevers, inflammations. Complaints come on suddenly. Possible causes: cold/dry wind; fright / shock. Characterised by extreme restlessness and fear. May specifically have an unfounded fear of death. Dry. hot skin. Symptoms worse in: evening / around midnight. Thirsty for cold drinks. May say everything tastes bitter, except water. Better for: fresh air. Worse for: touch.

Allium Cepa - Common, feverish cold with streaming eyes and nose. Profuse, watery nasal discharge which burns upper lip. Red, running eyes with bland discharge. Headache, worse in warm room. Worse: evening and stuffy rooms. Better: open air and cold room.

Arsenicum album - Catches cold easily: burning, watery nasal discharge alternating with dryness. Frequent sneezing without relief. Very chilly and shivery. Nostrils become sore and red and nose feels blocked alternating with watery discharge. Worse: change of temperature, cold, damp and after midnight. Better: heat and warm applications, hot drinks.

Eupatorium perfoliatum - Chill followed by heat and sweating. Intense aching of bones as if broken or bruised. Great thirst for cold drinks. Worse: movement, cold, open air. Better: Resting, warmth, sweating.

Ferrum Phos - Tired and weary, not feeling quite right. First signs of a cold or flu. Red inflamed eyes. Chill with shivering and fever with flushed face. Hot, burning, gritty eyes. Worse: quick movements, cold air. Better: rest, cold applications.

Gelsemium - No 1 remedy for flu. Dull, sluggish, with heavy looking eyes and dull headache usually at the back of the neck. Chills and shivering up and down the spine. Aching muscles in limbs and back. Burning throat. Colds and flu usually comes on gradually. Worse: cold, damp weather. Better: after urination.

Nux vomica - Colds and flu with extreme chilliness; just cannot get warm. Nose blocked at night but runs during the day, or lots of sneezing alternating with blocked nose, sides can alternate. Sore or raw throat and teeth may ache. Thirsty and Irritable. Worse: early morning, eating, cold air. Better: heat, lying down, sleep.


Pulsatilla - Chilliness even in a warm room, nasal catarrh, bland and thick. Dry mouth with no thirst. Painful headache with changing, shifting symptoms. Worse: in a warm room, after lying down. Better: in the open air.

Rhus toxicodendron - Very restless with aching in all muscles and stiffness. Just cannot get comfortable. Heat alternating with chills; pain in the head and eyes with red face. Worse: night, first movement. Better: warmth.

Road Safety - WPC has received the Speed Statistics taken in January at the eastern end of the village. The metro counter was in place from 15th - 22nd January. WPC continues to be concerned about the number of vehicles exceeding the 30 mph speed limit. Of the 19,885 vehicles passing this point in our village, 8,720 were breaking the speed limit.

This means that more than 40% of vehicles are still travelling above the legal limit for our village and it is evident from the speed watch data collected that the Community Speed Watch volunteers are providing an invaluable service by slowing vehicles down by virtue of their presence. We sincerely thank them for their contribution in deterring vehicles from speeding through the village.

WPC is committed to improving road safety in the village and will continue to address this regularly at our meetings.

Rose & Crown - Following the request by members of the public for the Parish Council to register the pub as an Asset of Community Value (ACV), it now appears that this could prevent a potential sale of the pub. Therefore, for the moment, WPC have agreed to withdraw the application to register the building as an ACV in order to maximise the opportunity for the pub to be sold as a going concern. If necessary, we do have the option to re-apply to register the pub as an ACV in the future.

Worton Tree Regeneration - As mentioned in the last message, WPC would like to initiate a tree planting programme to replace trees which have been lost for a variety of reasons within the village. If you have a suitable piece of land where you would like to plant trees or you would like to nominate a place in the village which would be appropriate, then please contact us with your ideas. We intend to apply for a grant to cover the costs.

Village Survey - To help plan for the future in terms of housing and facilities for the village, WPC will shortly be carrying out a Village Survey. This will be distributed to residents and the council would be grateful if as many residents as possible would please take some time to complete it in order to help us to consider what the future requirements for the village might be.

Youth Projects - A presentation by Wiltshire Council, and local church-based youth workers took place outlining plans to meet the needs of young people in the area. Further information is available at www.facebook.com/DevizesLYN, www.wiltshireyfc.org.uk.

It may still be winter for a few weeks yet, but spring is on its way. The days are getting longer, the snowdrops are out and when the sun shines, it is just about possible to feel a little warmth.

The economy is rather like that. Slowly, the gloom of the worst recession since the war is beginning to lift. On the most recent data, for example, only 2.0% of 18 to 24 year olds in Wiltshire were on Job Seekers Allowance, and the proportion is steadily falling. Just 1.1% of 16 year olds were not in education, employment or training. That amounts to a mere 53 individuals, all of whom have access to support to help them find their feet and to plan for the future.

From another angle, there is a burst of new business formation. At the last count, 2,825 businesses in Wiltshire were under 2 years old. Starting a new business can be tough so if you know someone locally who has set up a new enterprise, I urge you to give them your support and your custom. The whole local economy will benefit from their success.

Of course, a growing economy poses some challenges. The construction industry has been one of the first sectors to feel the upturn and that, to most of us, must be a good thing. However, having regard to the "education" part of my portfolio responsibilities (the others are "skills" and "youth"), the result has been that bids for school building contracts are coming in rather higher than I would wish. I am delighted, therefore, that government has agreed to increase the amount of capital available to Wiltshire for "basic need" (i.e. new school places) to nearly £16 million in 2017/18 (up from £5.4m in 15/16 and £5.7m in 16/17).

Not everything in the economic garden is rosy, of course, and there may be storms still to come. But there are unmistakable signs that we are past the worst.
