

Letter from the Vicarage



Do you remember any big events in your life which you thought might overwhelm you? When we moved to our first parish we felt completely out of our depth, and when our first child was born we both felt totally inadequate for the responsibility that came with a baby. You may identify with those feelings from your own life.

The amazing thing, looking back, is that you simply get on with it. There is no choice but to knuckle down and do what has to be done.

For Ann and me, as we face retirement, there will be a lot of adapting to do. A new lifestyle and a different community bring opportunities but also challenges. And for you here, especially in the church communities, the period between one Vicar and another (known as an interregnum) will bring new demands. We all wonder how we are going to cope, that is part of being human. What we know is – we will cope.

The big question when facing new situations is; where is our foundation, our security to help us through? There is only one answer to that question which in the end is satisfactory. We need to rely on someone who will always be there for us, will never let us down, who knows us well enough to understand what we need, and then has the power to help in all circumstances. The only one who fulfils all those criteria is God himself. Every other option one day will let us down, if only because as humans we are mortal and by definition cannot be here forever.

God is always the same, the one who was there before creation and who will still be there when one day everything is fulfilled when Jesus returns to earth.

In the meantime we are called to journey on 'with hope in our hearts' as the song says, always looking for where God is leading us next.

I recently came across this saying which has stuck with me: 'Don't look back; you are not going that way.'

Humans have a tendency when faced with difficulties to retreat in to the past. The past is OK if we use it to inform where we are going next, but not if we use it to try and avoid the future.

Our Christian God is the God of the now and the future, leading His people forward, urging them to look back only when they can learn lessons which are of use now.

At one critical point in history God said to a man called Joshua: 'Be strong and courageous, for I am with you wherever you go'. And Jesus, just before he left his friends to return to heaven said: 'I am with you always, even to the end of the age'. Both of those promises were for people facing challenging situations and apply not just then, but to all followers of Jesus forever.

Whilst we cannot know in detail what is in store for us over the coming months and years, we do know that God's will for us is always the best and that he will walk with us through every situation we have to face.

So we can all look to the future with faith, hope and love because those are characteristics of the God who calls us on, and he WILL be with us, always.

Prior to the published business of the meeting, tribute was paid to the late Cllr. Peter Lewis. Pete gave many years of loyal service to the community and commiserations go to Pam and all the family.

- 1. A contract is being drawn up for ongoing maintenance of the Green and this will be put to tender shortly.
- 2. There has been a disappointing result from recent works to upgrade our Broadband service. Open Reach will be contacted to see if they can improve matters in the near future
- 3. MPC agreed to donate £1000 from the community fund to support proposed works on the Village Hall toilet upgrade.
- 4. The proposed development for land owned by Marston and Worton Charity was outlined and received a strong level of support in spite of some concerns regarding access to the site.
- 5. The introduction of chickens to Five Lanes School has been concluded and thanks to generous help provided by Robert Elliot has been completed under budget.





'Spend a Penny' Campaign

The Trustees would like to thank Worton Parish Council and Marston Parish Council for making substantial grants from their community funds to the 'Spend a Penny' campaign. This has enabled us to complete phase one of the work we have planned, which is to reconnect the heating system to the inner foyer and the toilets, with money remaining to put towards phase two, which is to redesign the toilets and make them more user friendly. Thanks must also go to Good Energy who make this funding available from their solar farm revenue.

These grants, along with another generous grant from Devizes Area Board, mean that we are now over halfway towards achieving the amount we need to complete the work. Thanks also to the Area Board for their grant.

Trustees are now busy applying for additional grants from other organisations and hope to be able to start the work in Spring 2017.

Hallmark Achievement

The Trustees are very pleased to announce that the Village Hall has achieved the Hallmark 2 award. Hallmark is a quality standard for village halls and shows that a hall has good policies, protocols, practices etc. There are three levels to it. Earlier this year we achieved the basic award which is Hallmark one, and now we have the more advanced one. So look out 2017/18 when we hope to apply for the third and most advanced level. Having Hallmark accreditation tells a potential hirer that the hall is well run and looked after and is particularly important when applying for improvement grants.

Maintenance

Thanks also to Five Lanes Women's Institute for under taking a deep clean and organisation of the kitchen. It is great when villagers pitch in to help keep the Hall going. If you would like to help please look out for maintenance mornings starting again in the New Year. There are always little jobs that need doing and these are fun mornings when you get a chance to meet other villagers too. Mystery tours can be quite exciting but, generally speaking, if you are on a journey it's probably good to know where you are going.

The same is true about money. Most of us have at least some idea of what to expect next month or next year, even if the exact amount could vary a little. None of us, I assume, would wish to be in the situation of not knowing where our next meal was coming from.

For Wiltshire Council, there has always been a degree of uncertainty about how much income the local authority should expect for the financial year ahead. Government has often left it quite late in the budget-setting season before disclosing how much the council will receive in grants so planning expenditure on all sorts of services has been a matter of guesswork.

Of course, quite a lot of the government money that passes through Wiltshire's hands is ring fenced for specific purposes so the Council does not have any direct influence on the income or the expenditure. Of the annual budget of about £900 million, £558 million is already committed for schools, benefits or the Housing Revenue account. The remaining £342 million comes from Council Tax and something called the Settlement Funding Assessment. The SFA (you may think the initials are apt) is what government gives us back from the rates paid by businesses on their properties in the county (they take it all and we then get some back) or as Revenue Support Grant.

Now, for the first time ever, the government has offered the Council the opportunity to sign up for a settlement that covers the next 4 years. You might reasonably think that is not exactly exciting news, but it actually marks a substantial change. For the first time, Wiltshire Council will know how much it will receive from government not just next year but up until 2020.

Good news? Well, yes and no. On the one hand, Wiltshire will be able to plan its budgets with certainty. On the other hand, the government will continue to cut its contribution under the Revenue Support Grant until, by 2019/20 it disappears altogether. They will give us back a little more of the business rates collected in the county but a large chunk of that money will still go to support poorer areas (Scunthorpe is often used as an example, but I don't know why they are singled out). The net result will be we have to find another £30 million savings over the next few years.

The Council is experienced at becoming leaner and fitter. I wish I was the same.

What's happening on the Farm!

The beginning of autumn has been kind to us farmers. Jobs have been completed with the rain being not too much of a problem. We have however had a few mornings with a touch of frost, a sign that the seasons are definitely changing.

The maize has been cut and with a yield of about 17 tonnes to the acre; we were relatively happy with this. It did not have a particularly good start; the cold and damp growing conditions in the spring were not ideal and the seeds were planted in cold soil which meant they did not germinate as quickly as we would have liked. However this year we sold the maize to a neighbouring farmer who has invested heavily in a bio digester plant. He will feed the maize he has harvested from his own farm and from other farms into huge storage tanks where the process of anaerobic digestion takes place which produces bio-gas (a renewable energy). This gas will then be used to drive a generator which will produce electricity which will be fed into the national grid. Other waste products can also be used however maize is a high in energy crop that is very compatible for this process.

We have brought the younger heifers in for winter housing. When left out too long in the autumn, with the cold rain and autumn grass (not so much energy), they begin to loose condition. Because of this, we made the decision to bring them in to put them onto their winter ration so they keep putting on condition rather than losing it. As soon as they were brought in we wormed them as their vaccination had ran out; it was most important it was done. The rest of the animals will run over the farm until mid-November (weather depending), eating the remainder of the grass ready for winter.

With the cattle coming in for the winter months, the fields will be empty however I must ask for all dog walkers to keep to the footpaths and respect the wildlife that exists on our farm.
