TOPP, SIDNEY THOMAS - Private 5567712 - Royal Ordnance Army Corps - Died 29th May 1945 of Tuberculosis at Salisbury Isolation Hospital - Age 31 - Son of Joseph and Emma Topp*** of Market Lavington; Husband of Hazel Katherine Priscilla Topp (nee Henly) of Worton; Father of Alice, Lancelot, Eric, Dawn and Rayna Topp - Buried at Market Lavington (St. Mary The Assumption) Churchyard, Market Lavington - Grave/Memorial Reference:- North Part - Headstone inscription reads:- "We Wish You Were Near, So We Could Take You Hand And Whisper, "Peace, My Dear", Loving Wife & Children."

ELLIS, ALBERT WILLIAM - Private 4618513 - 2nd Battalion Sherwood Foresters (Notts & Derby Regiment) - Died 24th April 1943, while serving with the 8th Army in North Africa - Aged 23 - Husband of Betty Lydia Ellis of Worton - Buried in Massicault War Cemetery, Tunisia - Grave/Memorial Reference:- V. B. 17. - The headstone inscription reads:- "Peace, Perfect Peace, To Meet Once Again, Only To Part, But Never To Be Forgotten." - Commemorated on the Worton Village War Memorial, Library Hall Grounds, Worton.

ELLIS, JAMES EDWARD - Ordinary Seaman C/JX348741 - Royal Navy - Died 8 November 1942 aboard H. M. S. Walney which was destroyed in the harbor of Oran, North Africa whilst attempting to land ground troops - Aged 19 - Son of William and Elsie Margaret Ellis of Devizes - Commemorated on the Chatham Naval Memorial, Chatham, Kent - Grave/Memorial Reference:- Panel 57. Section 2.

HENLY/HENLEY, RAYMOND GLEN WHITTON - Stoker 1st Class D/KX90386 - Royal Navy - Died 13th September 1944 as a result of a motor accident while serving aboard H.M.S. Angelo - Son of Harry Launcelot and Alice Janet Pender Henly (nee Whitton); Husband of Joan Henley of Edinburgh, Scotland. Father of Raymond and Joan. - Buried in Bari War Cemetery, Italy - Grave/Memorial Reference:- XI. B. 11. - Commemorated on the Worton Village War Memorial, Library Hall Grounds, Worton - Named in the Royal Navy Section Memorial Book, Scottish National War Memorial, Edinburgh Castle, Edinburgh, Scotland.

RIVINGTON, PAUL SANGSTER - Aircraftman 2nd Class/U/T Wireless Operator/Air Gunner 903070 - Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve - Died 10th July 1941 in a training accident - Age 21 - Twin brother of Peter Sangster Rivington; Educated at Dauntsey School, West Lavington Buried at Cranwell (St. Andrew) Churchyard, Cranwell, Lincolnshire - Grave/Memorial Reference:- Plot 2. Row D. Grave 18. - Commemorated on the Dauntsey School Memorial, West Lavington - Commemorated by a table top bible

stand in Christchurch, Worton - The inscription reads:- "To The Glory Of God And In Proud And Loving Memory Of Paul Sangster Rivington RAF 10th July 1941. "O What The Joy And The Glory Must Be"."
