1800-1849

1818

On Saturday afternoon Mr Justice Abbot arrived in this city from Winchester, and opened the commission for holding the Assizes for the County, the business of which commences this day.

The following prisoners (sixty-eight in number) are on our calendar for trial: John Broomfield, charged with having married Susan Pope at Christchurch, and afterwards feloniously married Elizabeth Head at Wylve, his first wife being alive.

John Broomfield, for bigamy, to be fined 1s. and imprisoned 12 months.

1843

Wilts Epiphany Sessions William Fryer, charged with having stolen a silver watch, the property of Richard Bailey, at Whilley. Guilty: 7 years transportation.

Wiltshire Independent, 12 January 1843

Wilts Quarter Sessions. Seven years' transportation: Wm. Fryer, stealing a watch at Wylve.

Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 14 January 1843

1844

Committed to Fisherton Gaol: Thomas Cooper, of Wylve, For one month, for assault.

1847

Wilts Midsummer Sessions. Sentences of the prisoners: Imprisonment with hard labour
Three months Ann Clark, stealing flat-irons at Wylve.
