We have much pleasure in announcing, that, on Wednesday last, a new School room was opened in the village of Wylve for the Sunday and daily instruction of the children of that parish in the principles and faith of the Church of England. The building, which is remarkably neat and commodious, has been completed by the exertions of the rector, the Rev. F. Baker, aided by the contributions of his Grace the Duke of Somerset, the Earl of Pembroke, and the principal inhabitants of the place. We sincerely wish that the higher classes in every parish were in like manner alive to the importance of affording the means of education to the children of their poorer brethren, and would make the same generous efforts to promote so beneficial a measure.
