Will of John Perrior Proved 1791



I John Perrior of Wiley in the County of Wiltshire Innholder calling to mind the certainty of Death and the uncertainty of its call Do publish and declare my last Will and Testament in manner and form following (that is to say) ffirst I give and bequeath unto my six Children Ann Mary Sarah Roger Thomas and John one shilling each Also I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Mary all that my Messuage or Tenement commonly called or known by the Name or Sign of the Bell situate at Wiley aforesaid and every Part and Parcel thereof with the Appurtenances To hold the same unto my said Wife Mary her Executors Administrators and Assigns for and during all my Term Interest and Estate therein now to come and unexpired And as for and concerning all the rest Residue and Remainder of my Goods Chattells Stock ready Money and Securities for money and Personal Estate and Effects whatsoever and wheresoever after my Debts Legacy and ffuneral Expences shall be fully Paid off and discharged I give and bequeath the same unto my said Wife Mary whom I do hereby make nominate constitute and appoint full and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I the said John Perrior the Testator have to this my last Will and Testament set my hand and Seal the tenth day of November in the ffourteenth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the third by the Grace of God of Great Britain ffrance and Ireland King Defender of the ffaith and so forth And in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy three John Perrior
