

Why do I look at the names on war memorials and find out as much as I can about the men who are commemorated? My interest started when I used to go to the church in West Kington, North Wiltshire, where I grew up. The memorial in the church there is a stone plaque with, until recently, 3 names inscribed. All three were men killed during the First War. A fourth name had been added of an airman who was killed during the Second War. The names intrigued me, who were they? Where did they live in the small village? Where were they killed and where are they buried? I asked the church team but no one could answer my questions.

It was after I had joined the Royal Air Force and served through the Gulf War in 1991 that I decided to satisfy my curiosity and find out more details about the memorial. I was spurred into action by hearing the Radio 4 "Today" programme's "Thought for the Day" on 11th November 1997. The person giving the "Thought" said words to the effect of, the memorials are inscribed with "Their names livethe for evermore" and we say that "We will remember them" but unless we actually read the names and know who they were, how can we remember them?

I carry out the research into the men commemorated on the war memorial using 2 main sources; the CD-ROM version of "Soldiers Died in World War 1" and the Commonwealth War Graves Commission web site.

Soldiers Died in World War 1 is a multi volume book was produced at the end of the Great War by each regiment and lists the soldiers who were *known* to have been killed or died from illness whilst on active service during the war.

It is the responsibility of the Commonwealth War Graves Commission (CWGC) to permanently mark and maintain the graves of the men and women of the forces of the Commonwealth and certain civilians who died in the two world wars. Another responsibility is the commemoration by name of all those who graves are unknown or are buried at sea.

The CWGC has its own web site with a facility to search for the commemoration details of individuals and cemetery or memorial descriptions. I have included the descriptions from the site, shown in *italics*, for each person.

I try and trace the details on all the names on the memorial. Sadly sometimes I am not successful. This can be for a variety of reasons. The main reason is that the person had a common name which produces too many returns. The details recorded against the name by "Soldiers" or the CWGC are too vague or non-existent to allow me to say that I have the correct man. Also, a man might be commemorated on the local war memorial but he has a very tenuous link with the area. For example, he worked in the area before joining up but was born and brought up in a totally different town and his service records contain these details. Likewise, if the village is very small, I have found that a man would give his place of birth or where he was living as the nearest big town or village. It's quite easy to imagine the recruiting officer saying "where is that?" and the recruit saying "it's near....." the nearby town was then recorded.

The other reason is because a number of soldiers died from wounds received in action but had been discharged form the Army by the time they died. Many are listed on local war memorials but are missing from official records. They are, in effect, not recorded as having made the ultimate sacrifice.

Alternatively there are quite often some names which have been left off the local war memorials despite having died and been recognised as war deaths. When the war memorials were being built, there seems to have been no hard and fast rule on who should be commemorated. Some areas would not inscribe a name unless they were actually killed or died as a result of combat. Yet others have commemorated men who died as a result of accident or illness and not in anyway linked to service. Also some next of kin did not want the name inscribed for whatever reason.

War Grave Eligibility

The CWGC records the place of burial or commemoration of all members of the Commonwealth armed forces who died *no matter where and no matter what the cause* (Courage Remembered 1988) during the periods 4th August 1914 until 31st March 1921. These dates were chosen as the start of the war and the official date of the end of the first war and not the Armistice. For the second war, the dates are 3rd September 1939 until 31st December 1947. Again the dates were chosen as the start of the war and a period of time after the war's end to roughly cover the same length of time between 11th November 1918 and the official end of the war. These period after the end of the wars allows for men who died of wounds after the Armistice to be treated as war deaths.

As stated, all members of the Commonwealth Armed forces are entitled to a war grave. In addition certain civilian organisations are also entitled, provided that they died on duty because of the increased risks through the war. The organisations include the Mercantile Marine and other merchant navies, fishing fleets, war correspondents, Red Cross, Home Guard, National Fire Service, RAF Ferry Command and several others.

In the text, unless otherwise stated, cemetery details and photographs are taken from the CWGC web site.

Personal Recollections and Pictures

Unfortunately the official records only hold the barest details. I would like to include personal recollections and photographs of the people commemorated. I try and include any relevant photographs alongside the details to add interest. Ultimately I would like to have a picture of the person as well as their headstones.

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at the back there in is a sprinkling fountain, the water rising through a pitcher overflowing into a granite basin, then into a larger basin and finally into the cattle drinking fountain, while at the same time, water discharges at s other points connected direct to the town's water mains. The whole of the new masonry is of stone from the Hornton quarries, Oxfordshire. The durability of the stone being proved by the fact that there are memorials existing today in a good state of preservation which were erected many centuries ago. Mr G Parker-Pearson of Grittleton, is the architect responsible for the design of the memorial, which has been carried out in the same efficient and artistic manner as the other memorials that he has done. The design was one chosen by the Council from others submitted in competition and there is no doubt that Mr Parker-Pearson's particular treatment and use of the original fountain gained him the honour of his design being accepted and all alike are loud in their praise of his work. The memorial was built by Messers JF Booth and Sons of Banbury, Oxfordshire.

On the day of the unveiling, the weather was good. A large number of people turned out to witness the ceremony. Prominence in the crowd was given to ex-servicemen; two of their number were invited to unveil the memorial. 175 ex-servicemen under the command of Lt Bishop and Sgt Banks marched into the square, preceded by the Salvation Army Band. Capt Booth of the building contractors and Mr Parker-Pearson were introduced to Lord Methuen.

At 3pm the ceremony commenced with the crowd singing the hymn 'O God, our help in ages past'. There followed a reading of the 90th Psalm by Archdeacon Talbot of Swindon. Prayers were said by Rev WH Gorham. Then the memorial was unveiled. The memorial was covered by a large Union Jack, which was removed by George Wood MM, son of Mr Joseph Wood, a late Company Sgt Maj of the Wiltshire Regt, and Reginald Neate (late AB Royal Navy, Jutland.)

The Mayor said that they "had unveiled the Cenotaph to the memory of their Country men who went forth, endured hardship, faced danger and finally passed out of sight of men in the path of sacrifice, through the gate of death". The care of the memorial devolved upon the corporation of that borough for all time and "on whose behalf he accepted that responsibility and trust."

Pte HA Drummer, late Wiltshire Regiment, who had lost a leg, laid a wreath in the form of a cross on behalf of all the ex-servicemen. There then followed a 2 minutes silence, which was broken by Buglers Harris and Drewitt sounding Reveille.



Unveiling War Memorial

On Sunday afternoon (5th June) a tablet bearing the names – 15 in number – of the men from this parish who lost their lives in the war, was unveiled in the church the presence of a large congregation. The service was conducted by the Canon Wrangham, a former rector and now Rural Dean of Cricklade and Rev JS Fowle, the present rector. The lesson was read by Mr EH Clutterbuck and the tablet was unveiled by Colonel J Hankey, and the subsequent dedication being performed by Canon Wrangham who gave a short address and “The Last Post” being sounded by Mr Jones of Chippenham.

The tablet bears the inscription: “In Glorious memory of the men of this parish who gave their lives for their country in the Great War 1914 – 1918”

As it was essentially just a school ceremony, those present were scholars, governors and friends of the school and included the Mayor and Mayoress.




St Andrews Church

Rood Screen

The rood screen, which forms the memorial to the men of the St Andrew's parish who fell in the war. The screen was designed by Mr FE Howard of Oxford. He was considered to have been one of the greatest experts on church wood works in the country. The construction work was carried out by the Warham Guild and Messers Mowbray, also of Oxford. The cost of the memorial was £1,150.



On either side of the Rood screen are panels listing the men from the parish of St Andrews who were killed.



St Pauls Church

The Memorial in St Paul's church takes the form of a small wooden altar flanked by 2 wooden panels on which, the names of the killed are inscribed. The altar is topped by a wooden cross, which was used during the First War in a Military hospital at Rouen, France.

<p>Death of the Rev WP Ainley</p> <p>To many of our readers especially in St Paul's district, the Rev WP Ainley will be remembered as a former curate at St Paul's where he laboured for a for about 2 years and left last year with the intention of proceeding to the Mission Field in China. The outbreak of the war led to a change in his plans and Mr Ainley became an Army chaplain at Aldershot, where he unfortunately contracted spotted fever. He lay in a prostrate condition being affected mentally as well as physically but a change for the better came and it was hoped that the rev gentleman would pull through. A change for the worse, however, set in and Mr Ainley passed on Wednesday. The sad news was conveyed to his father , the Rev FW Ainley, vicar of Uffington, Lincs, who at the time was at Bath taking part in a series of devotional meetings.</p> <p>The Rev Ainley was a much liked during his curacy at St Paul's where he laboured with much acceptance and when he left the esteem of the parishioners was expressed in a presentation being made to him. The Rev gentleman was a keen supporter of the missionary work and he stated before leaving St Paul's that his missionary spirit was intensified at an exhibition held in Chippenham about 3 years ago and it was this then that he made the resolve to go to China, a resolve which death has now prevented being put into practice and all will regret the cutting short of a promising career.</p> <p>Wilts Times 16 Oct 1915</p> <p>ARMY CHAPLAINS DEPARTMENT. The Reverend W. P. Ainley, temporary Chaplain to the Forces, 4th Class, relinquishes his commission on account of ill health. Cpl Alderton who had escaped from trench on left of BECELARE road together with Privates Dunn Holister and Jones being apparently last to leave the trenches, gathered stragglers together and formed a rear guard to Brigade ambulances by opening out in skirmishing order. On arrival at 7th Divisional HQ he was met by Cpl Bull, and in the evening the APM took party numbering 26 back to Brigade HQ where they met Cpl Richens and 50 men which included about 12 Lance Corporals. The majority of these men had been driven from their trenches by artillery fire the previous evening. The Quarter master hearing that Lieut Macnamara was wounded visited him at the field hospital and afterwards about 4pm collected the 50 men above mentioned taking them to Brigade HQ and was informed that no news of Battalion had been received since early morning.</p> <p>NOTE : special mention should be made of the gallant worth of Capt Comyn, the medical officer and stretcher bearers who for the last three days and nights were continuously handling wounded or burying dead.</p>

The men were moved up communication trenches in small parties. The dugouts in the crater were wrecked by trench motars and heavy casualties sustained here. The fire trenches on the left were obliterated and the main CT completely blown in many places. At dark B coy relieved C Coy and D Coy were sent up to work at repairing the firing line. <p>The Roll of Honour</p> <p>Mr and Mrs Edwards of the Causeway have received the intelligence that their son, Orlando, who in the early part of 1915 joined the Wiltshire Regiment, has been killed in France. The officer commanding his company in writing to Mr and Mrs Edwards and expressing the sympathy of himself and comrades, says of Pte Edwards "He was very smart courageous and painstaking and popular with everybody". Prior to joining up Pte Edwards was employed in connection with the Post Office and was auxiliary postman to Tytherton.</p> <p>Wilts Times 30 June 1917</p> <p>Killed in action in France, Pte Orlando Edwards, son of Mr and Mrs Edwards of 31 The Causeway, Chippenham. Aged 31.</p> <p>Wilts Times 7 July 1917</p> <p>The Price of Freedom</p> <p>Above we give the portrait of Pte Orlando Edwards, son of Mr and Mrs Edwards of 31 The Causeway whose name is added to the list of those who have `heroes all` who have laid down their lives for King and Country.</p> <p>Pte Edwards joined the Army on 25th Jan 1915. Prior to that he was employed at the Chippenham Post Office where he commenced duty in May 1912, acting as a temporary Postman. Subsequently being given the Auxiliary Postmanship to Tytherton, which he held at the time of his enlistment.</p> <p>The Chippenham postmaster in expressing his sympathy with the parents observes "Orlando was a general favourite, always willing and ready to do whatever was required of him and his loss is mourned by the whole staff. He was a quiet well conducted lad, generally popular and respected by the whole staff, a respect which was greatly enhanced by his prompt response to his country's call".</p> <p>In regard to his death in France, Signaller MacDonald, RDF, writing to his parents states: "In the last advance I found the body of your son, Orlando, with his pay book and letter lying beside him. On seeing this I thought it best to write to you and let you know he died a hero's death and accept my deepest sympathy. I may also add that he had an instantaneous death. I saw that his body was removed and he had a soldier's funeral, being buried with hundreds of the bravest of the brave."</p> <p>Lt Wing of the Wilts wrote: "He was as you doubtless know one of the special battalion bombers so did not often parade with us but we were always glad when he did so for he was very smart, courageous and painstaking and popular. The news has not been confirmed by the War Office but was, the parents state, conveyed to them by a comrade, and the father in order, as he puts it, to avenge his sons death went at once joined Kitchener's Army.</p> <p>L/Cpl Fox had proved himself a plucky lad. He was formerly with his father in the bill posting business and enlisted in the Gloucester Regiment and also the Somerset's, but was bought out. When war broke out he again joined the Army and has been in France for some time.</p> <p>Mr and Mrs Fox have another son who is a prisoner in Germany and this morning's post brought a letters from him in which he appeals to his parents to send food, in particular white bread.</p> <p>Wilts Times 23 April 1915</p> <p>L/Cpl Fox was the second soldier from 1 Wilts to be executed during the War. Unlike the previous victim (in 1914 aged 33) Fox was a young man of 20 attached to 3 Division Cyclists Company when he deserted. He was tried during April 1915 and executed at Dickebusch on the 20th April 1915. L/Cpl Fox came from Chippenham and was buried at Dickebusch New Military Cemetery, Belgium. His grave carries the inscription "In loving memory of our dearly beloved Son. Gone but not forgotten". Fox is also commemorated in Chippenham on the Parish Church Roll of Honour and on the town War Memorial, suggesting that his parents were not told the true circumstances surrounding their son's death. At the time however, the official army policy was to inform relatives of the true cause of death, and also to specify the offence.</p> <p>8992 L/Cpl JSV Fox aged 20 executed for desertion on 20 April 1915. 1 Wilts attached to 3 Div Cycle Co. Below we give the photo of Bugler J Hatherell, son of Mr JW and Mrs Hatherell of Lowden Hill.</p> <p>Bugler Hatherell was formerly employed at the Chippenham Signal Works but when war broke out - he was only 16 years of age at the time he was working at Melksham. He joined the Wilts and went to France, where on June 4th, he was severely wounded. He was taken to the base hospital at Boulogne and hopes were entertained at first that he would recover and it would be possible to eventually remove him to England but unfortunately he got worse and on July 4th just a month after he received his wounds he succumbed. The news was conveyed to the bereaved parents in the following letter: -</p> <p>No 13 Base Hospital Boulogne Dear Mr and Mrs Hatherell: I am indeed most sorry to have to convey to you the sad news that your dear boy died this afternoon. Yesterday he seemed a little better, if anything, but he collapsed today. I saw him early this morning and we said a prayer together, but he quite suddenly, after dinner got worse and expired in a few minutes. I know how much he longed to get back home and how much you longed to have him, so I can feel most sincere sympathy and I pray that our Heavenly Father may pour into your bleeding hearts His holy comfort and give you strength to bear bravely such a grievous blow. Orders had been received previously that the Battn would take the trenches R31.C.78, R31.A.48, R.31.a.5.5, R.31.a.9.41, R.31.a.9.3, R.31.b.0.3, 2.3.3.2,3.1.5.1,5.0, R31.d.7..9.9.8. Late on the night of the 2nd/3rd written orders were received that the only attack to be made were upon the lines, R.31.C.4.6 to R.31.a.5.5 and upon R.31.c.7.6 to R.31.a.9.1, R.31.d.4.8., R.31.d.07. This meant that both the flanks of this Battn were exposed. The Battn arrived in position in trenches at 2.30 without casualty in spite of heavy shelling. The intense bombardment began at 5.10a.m. and the troops moved out of the trenches and formed up about 50 yards off and advanced upon their objective. As soon as they had left the trench they were met by a heavy 'whizbang' fire, and almost at the same time machine guns from either flank opened upon them. Our right Coy (D) stated that they got into the enemy trench and were wiped out by our own barrage which did not lift in time. The centre and left Coys report that their heavy losses were due to machine gun fire from both flanks. By the time they reached their objective they were numerically inferior to the enemy. The left Coy reached and occupied R.31.C.8.9. And made a block there. The few men in the other Coys who reached the enemy trench were forced to retire owing to their lack of numbers. The true position was not known at this time, and the reserve Coy was sent up to strengthen the line, but as far as could be ascertained, they were knocked out by machine gun fire from the flanks. Shortly after the officers commanding right and centre Coys reported that they had been able to get back with infinite difficulty, and very few men and that the attack had failed. The CO was hit by a bullet in the leg. Five other officers became casualties. At about 11a.m. orders were received that the Battn should proceed back in small parties to BOUZINCOURT, which was duly undertaken. The last of the Battn arrived at their billets at about 5p.m.</p>



H B L B) Order of march C - Machine guns - A - B companies "Move by a steep and winding course to a cup-shaped deformation at the head of the Gully to the right and some distance in front of our salient." (Words of 2 Lieut R.W.M. Dewhurst one of the few officers on the march who subsequently survived.) The Battalion was guided, as far as I am able to ascertain by a New Zealand Officer. Here they arrived two hours before sunrise (circa 0.300) and the men were told to dig into dugouts and make themselves comfortable as the position was quite safe. Men therefore removed equipment and rifles. This position I take it to be just N. of the H in Chunuk Bair and the march to it from the Aghyl Dere must have been via the APEX (Ref. Gallipoli Map 1.20,000 Koya Dere) (Circa) 4.30 a.m. As soon as it was light machine guns opened on the men lying in their dug outs. About 1/4 of an hour later there was a rush of Turks from both sides of the depression which drove the men, unarmed and unequipped down the gully (SALZLI BEIT). The bottom of the gully commanded by machine guns and so escape was cut off. Three courses were possible:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. To rush past the machine guns down the Sazli Beit, this was tried but in nearly all cases proved fatal. 2. To climb the northern slope of the ravine under fire and try to escape over the top. This was done in a few cases with success. 3. Hide in Gully till night, this also was done with more success. (A party of 5 men was rescued from the Gully having been there 16 days - ie:- from Aug 10 - Aug 26th. They reported numbers of men who were wounded, were unable to get away and died of exhaustion and starvation. H.B.L.B) <p>Parties arrived on the Beach in fours, fives, and some carried bodies during the 11th, 12th and 13th unarmed, unequipped and demoralised. The Battalion when mustered on the Beach mustered roughly 420 (This includes 76 men lately arrived as Details from Lemnos.)</p> <p>Officer casualties:- Lt Col. Mr and Mrs King well known residents of Lowden have received the sad intelligence of the death at the front of their son Pte G King of the Coldstream Guards.

Writing to the parents, C-S-M. J Gornall states: - Pte King was my servant or batman as we say. We were digging quite close together when a shell burst very close to us. Your son was struck with a piece. I saw it myself. Death was instantaneous, there was no suffering, which is a mercy. He was very much liked by his officers and comrades, which shows that he always did his work well and pleasantly. He went to the sacrament on the Sunday before going to the trenches. That too says a lot, I think.

Capt Dorrian of the same regiment also writes expressing his regrets and adds:- Pte King, poor fellow, was killed in action during the last battle of Ypres. All the men and myself will miss him. He was one of the finest soldiers we had and a great personal friend of mine. My sympathies are with you. The food parcel received from you has been given to his pals.

<p>Had been wounded at Gallipoli</p> <p>Chippenham Man Killed in Action</p> <p>Confirmation has been received of Private Harry Lucas, the fourth son of Mr and Mrs C Lucas of 74 Park Lane (1st Wiltshire Regiment) being killed in action. Pte Lucas joined the Wiltshire Regiment after the declaration of war and saw service in the Dardanelles, from which he was invalided home, but on his recovery he was drafted to the 1st Wiltshire Regiment in France.</p> <p>Before the war he was employed as a postman in connection with the post office. He was of a bright and cheery disposition and respected by all with whom he came in contact. He was a prominent footballer and a member of the Rovers team and a regular attendant t the Men's Own Brotherhood meetings at the Primitive Church.</p> <p>Mrs Lucas has received a letter from the sergeant of the platoon to which Pte Lucas belonged.</p> <p>Dear Madam</p> <p>I feel it is my duty to write and answer the letter which you enclosed in the last parcel which you sent to your son, Harry. In accordance with our usual custom, the contents of the parcel were distributed amongst his comrades. Although I know that it is impossible for me to comfort you in your great sorrow, I am now trying my best to forward to you the great sympathies of his comrades and myself. When your dear son was killed it seemed to throw a cloud over the whole company to which he belonged. He was always well liked by officers, NCO's and men, and often was the means of cheering many of us up, by his own cheery and pleasant nature.</p> <p>As his platoon sergeant, I was extremely sorry to lose him, as he was one of my best boys, always willing and ready to undertake any duty with a cheery spirit. He was also an extremely plucky and brave boy and is greatly missed by all who knew him. His death was caused through the bursting of a shell and I am thankful to be able to tell you that he suffered no pain, as his death was instantaneous. We buried him in the small cemetery about 3 miles behind the lines and erected a small wooden cross over his grave.</p> <p>With heartfelt sympathy, yours sincerely, Sgt WG Thomas Wilts Times 19 August 1916</p> <p>In loving memory of Private Harry Lucas 1st Wiltshire Regt. In the book “Somme” by Lyn Macdonald, Pte Roy Bealing MM relates his experiences of the attack by the 1st Wiltshire’s on the 5th or 6th of July 1916. “I was beside a young chap called Lucas and he was a bundle of nerves. He was shaking, yes. He was simply shivering and shaling like a leaf. He could hardly hold his rifle, never mind fix his bayonet. So I fixed mine and then I said “Here you are Lucas,” and I fixed his for him. It would have taken him a week to fix his bayonet, the state he was in!. He wasn’t one of the new draft. He was one of the older ones, and I was right sorry for him.”

The Wiltshire’s objective was a the second line of the German defences, the first line had already been captured. They were to the left of the village of la Boisselle. Between them and their objective was a huge mine crater which they did not know about.

Bealing says “When the whistle went, I threw my rifle on top of the trench and clambered out of it, grabbed my rifle nad started going forward. There were shell holes everywhere. I hadn’t gone far when I fell in one.” After getting up and carrying on, Bealing fell several more times. “ I must have fallen a dozen times before I got to the first line and there were lads falling all over the place. You didn’t know if they were tripping up or whether they were going down with bullets in them, because it wasn’t just the shells exploding round about, it was the machine guns hammering out like hell from the German third line. Lucas went down. He was killed before he even got to the first trench, the one that was partly in our hands.”

Bealing was wrong, Harry Lucas was not among the XX men killed in the attack but had been seriously wounded and died from his injuries on the 14 July 1916.

Also on Castle Combe Memorial

Among those who fell at Zeebrugge on April 23rd was Cpl RHR Neate son of the late Mr R Neate of Castle Combe and of Mrs Short now residing at Englands, Chippenham, whose husband Pte W Short formerly a postman at Chippenham is serving in France.

Cpl Neate had barley reached the age of 22. Educated at the school at Castle Combe and later a member of the church choir, he left home some years ago and was apprenticed to a motor tyre manufacturing company in Birmingham. But his liking was the sea and five years ago he joined the Royal Marines. He served for some time at Deal and had as a non commissioned officer officer, Sgt TJ Ball of Corsham. Later he went to the North Sea and then for some time was stationed in the Orkney Isles. He was home on leave about six weeks ago, returning to duty on March 27th. Soon after the attack on Zeebrugge was arranged. Cpl Neate was one of the volunteers in that hazardous undertaking. When the world was informed of the splendid account of our men on that occasion, the news was conveyed to Mrs Short as to many other proud though heartbroken mothers that her son was among those who had given their lives in their country's cause. It was intimated by the authorities that it would be possible for the body of Cpl Neate to be sent home for internment and through the good offices of the mayor, this was accomplished. The body returning to Chippenham on Sunday afternoon (28 April). The coffin covered with the Union Jack, was placed on a bier and conveyed from the station to the mother's home in Englands. Four wounded soldiers from the Red Cross Hospital accompanied the removal to the house. The arrival at the station coincided with the return there for entraining of the Volunteers who had been engaged in that alien drill at Westmead and as the coffin was conveyed from the station it passed in front of the men who formed up and came to the present. A similar honour was paid by the Volunteers met with passing through the town.

The funeral took place on Tuesday (30 April) and prior to the internment at Castle Combe, a service was held at the Chippenham Parish church. The vicar officiated and with the junior members of the choir met the cortege at the west door of the church. The coffin was carried by wounded soldiers from the Red Cross Hospital under the command of Sgt Wilson. The congregation included the Mayor and members of the corporation and also many towns' people.

At Castle Combe, there was a large assembly of villagers and black curtains were drawn at every house approaching the church. Chippenham Volunteers under Sgt Devonald formed the firing party. They were formed up and came to the present as the coffin was placed in the grave, which had been dug under a stately Yew tree in the church yard. The Rev FKL Appleyard officiated at the burial. After the service, three volleys were fired and Bugler L Wright sounded the Last Post. Amongst the mourners was Lt Cdr Watkins DSO.

Belgium, Becelare About 5.30am (just before daybreak) the enemy attacked in a very superior force but were driven back with heavy loss. They attacked again, and after about 2 hours of almost continuous fighting in which the enemy lost hundreds in killed and wounded, they broke through the lines having previously contrived to come around on our left through trenches that had been vacated with the exception of about 30 NCOs and men mostly from trenches on right the

remainder of Battalion were either killed or captured, a large number being captured. Cpl Alderton who had escaped from trench on left of BECELARE road together with Privates Dunn Holister and Jones being apparently last to leave the trenches, gathered stragglers together and formed a rear guard to Brigade ambulances by opening out in skirmishing order. On arrival at 7th Divisional HQ he was met by Cpl Bull, and in the evening the APM took party numbering 26 back to Brigade HQ where they met Cpl Richens and 50 men which included about 12 Lance Corporals. The majority of these men had been driven from their trenches by artillery fire the previous evening. The Quarter master hearing that Lieut Macnamara was wounded visited him at the field hospital and afterwards about 4pm collected the 50 men above mentioned taking them to Brigade HQ and was informed that no news of Battalion had been received since early morning.

NOTE : special mention should be made of the gallant worth of Capt Comyn, the medical officer and stretcher bearers who for the last three days and nights were continuously handling wounded or burying dead.

This attack drove back 'C' Coy and forced part of it into 'A' Coys trench. Unfortunately the end of 'A' Coys trench was uncovered by this attack the consequence of this was that a part of 'C' Coy were driven into the British trenches. Exactly what happened was not known at this time & it was believed that 'A' Coy had been captured. The German advance was easily stopped by 'D' Coy. 'C' Coy organized a new attack & made good progress assisted by the bombers of the 2 Yorks. But coming under heavy machine gun fire they were again driven back. These attacks were most unfortunate as they prevented the issue of water and rations. Still 'B' Coy got theirs & 'D' Coy got a rum issue.</p> <p>9.30 am - The Borders made an attack which was soon stopped as it was started through some mistake an hour before the artillery bombardment was timed to take place. This attack died away quickly.</p> <p>10.30am - The artillery bombardment and about 10.15am a new bombing attack was started along the German trench. Unfortunately LT Morison who led the attack was killed at once and the attack never really started. So the CO organized another with 1/2 platoon of 'B' Coy and the bombers of the Grenadier Guards. The CO led them out & this time the attack was quite successful.</p> <p>About 350 persons were captured by a mixed detachment chiefly Wilts. It was at this time the lost 'A' Coy were discovered in the British trench. So 'A' Coy was pushed forward to assist to hold the line. The CO went back to try and collect more men for the purpose so sent forward the remainder of 'B' Coy. The result was that at dusk this line nearly as far as 23-30 was held by a jumbled mass of Wilts, Gordons Warwicks & Scots Guards.</p>

He was promoted Captain in June 1916 and during the past 2 years had taken part in all the engagements that his regiment worthily upheld it's tradition and was mentioned in despatches. He contracted Spanish influenza whilst in France but got better. He obtained leave of absence and came home, where he arrived on September 30th. He was unfortunately seized with the old complaint and developed pneumonia, this proved fatal. The funeral took place on Saturday (12th October). Military honours were accorded and a firing party under the command of Sgt Maj May fired three volleys over the grave. The band of the Wiltshire Regiment led the cortege. The Price of Freedom

News has been received that Pte Ernest William Rose, Wiltshire Regiment was killed in action in Palestine on November 13th last. Deceased, who was 21 years of age, was the eldest son of Mr and Mrs Rose of 42 Tugela Road, Chippenham. He joined the Wiltshire Territorials in September 1914 and left England for India in October of that year, He remained in India till the regiment was ordered to Egypt on active service. Mr Rose, the father has received the following tribute to the life and character of his son.

British Red Cross Hospital

Gaza

Cairo

16 December 1917

Dear Mr Rose

I very much regret that illness in hospital has prevented me from writing sooner to express my sincere sympathy in the loss of your son Ernest William. He was as you no doubt have been officially informed, killed in action on the 13th November near the villages of Kustineh and Elmesmiyah and he is buried near the former village. He is a great loss to our company, for he was popular and during the last 18 months, the period I have been in command of B Company and knew him, he developed wonderfully and was a fine, strong, well set up and reliable soldier. Latterly he has been Mr Glendening's batman: I choose him at Kirkee, when Mr Glendening came to the regiment, for this work because I considered him a most trustworthy and loyal fellow. In this work I came into contact with, as he helped with our Company officers mess and we always got on excellently. Mr Glendening was ill and did not come up to the trenches with us, so your son returned to ordinary company work. Except that he acted as runner for his platoon commander, work which he performed creditably. I may add that I wanted to promote him when we were still in India as I considered he was entitled to advancement but he preferred to remain a Private, much to my regret.

We have indeed lost a splendid fellow and feel the deepest sympathy for you in losing him who had been absent from home for so long and whom you had not the opportunity of seeing since he had reached a full and exceptionally fine manhood.

Mr J Rose of Nelson Place, Chippenham has three sons serving in His Majesty's Forces and news has come to hand that one of them, Pte Roland Rose, who is serving in France in the 1st Wilts has, according to the man's own statement, been recommended for the Distinguished Conduct Medal. In His letter under the date 6 Sept sent to his parents "You will be pleased to know that I have been recommended for the DCM. I hope I shall be fortunate enough to get it. I don't think there is one DCM in our town at present and it will be a great honour to be the first Chippenham man to get it. PTE ROLAND ROSE

Recommended for DCM but killed.

As reported in the edition dated 18 September Pte Roland Rose was recommended for the DCM in letter sent to his father. "You will be pleased to know that I have been recommended for the DCM. I hope I shall be fortunate enough to get it. I don't think there is one DCM in our town at present and it will be a great honour to be the first Chippenham man to get it. I think myself lucky I am alive as we have just had a terrible bombardment losing about 130 of our chaps. It is said by some of the men that it was the worst bombardment all through the war. The Germans shelled our trenches for 3 days without stopping. I was recommended for digging a poor chap out who got buried by one of the German shells."

To this there has been a sad sequel for on Thursday morning (30th Sept) Pte Rose's mother received the following letter: "Dear Mrs Rose. I much regret to have to inform you that Pte Rose was killed by a shell when supporting an attack on the 25 September. He had been my servant for a few weeks and I had time to admire his courage and many good qualities. I feel that I have lost a good servant and a good friend. He was splendidly cool under the bombardment. It may be of some consolation to you to know that he did not suffer any pain being rendered unconscious at once.

I had the pleasure at the beginning of the month of recommending Pte Rose for bravery. A man was buried by the explosion of a shell and he volunteered to go out under heavy bombardment and dig him out. His sergeant who had asked for volunteers, and who has already been mentioned for this received the DCM, so you can be sure it was a gallant act. Be sure that every one act of bravery is seldom recognised officially; if it were so, few of them could remain long undiscovered.

Yours truly Arthur Hales. Capt."

(Capt Arthur Hoare Hales MC, previously wounded on 12th Mar 1915, was killed on 6th July 1916 on the Somme. He has no known grave and is commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial)

Previously wounded while serving at the front and came home on short leave but as soon as recovered volunteered for the front only to be killed and to be deprived of the honour which it was hoped awaited him of receiving the coveted medal. We trust that the honour, though the hero cannot receive it, will not be withheld, but that the medal, as a posthumous recognition will be forwarded to the family for Mr and Mrs Rose have 2 other soldier sons. One of whom was wounded some time ago. Monday's (27 Sept) post brought them the intelligence that another son Pte W Rose of 2 Wilts had also been wounded.

1st Btn Wiltshire Regt War Diary

Belgium, Hooge Report covering these operations. Positions were taken up on the night of 24th/25th as follows:- B Coy new slits SE of old assembly trenches S of MENIN road. A Coy 2 platoons H12. 2 platoons new trench dug 60 yds to rear of H12. D Coy RS5. C Coy 2 platoons RS4 2 platoons HALF WAY HOUSE C&D Coys were carrying until 1.30a.m. Battn was in position by 2a.m. Battn dressing station and HQ were completed close to RS5. The bombardment commenced at 3.50a.m. and the enemy bombardment commenced at 3.50a.m. and the enemy replied within 30 seconds by fierce artillery fire on front line and CTs, chiefly with field guns and small How's. A curtain of shrapnel was put in front of H12 and the assembly trenches there which was maintained for 2 hours. The MENIN Rd was swept with shrapnel as were the main CTs, GRAFTON, UNION & CASTLE Streets. HE shrapnel was put over H12 (A Coy) and the slits S of MENEN Road (B Coy). Telephone wires to all trenches & Bde HQ were immediately cut. The trenches occupied by Battn did not suffer much from heavy shell fire except the left of RS5 (D Coy) which was badly blown in at junctions of CTs. Certain other points were obviously marked and a constant fire of shrapnel was kept up at these places throughout the day. The main CTs were blown in, in many places but were not rendered unserviceable. During the operations they were of the utmost value for evacuating the wounded & relieving congestion in the front lines. At 7.30a.m. in an order to move up 1 Coy to the firing line was received from Bde HQ. This was carried out by B Coy who occupied a portion of C6, C7 having A Coy RIR on their left and a small party of 2nd S Lincs on the right. Later in the day the front line was considered to be too crowded and 1 platoon of this Coy was withdrawn to CTs. N of MENIN Road 3 M Guns of the Battn were in position in the firing line to support the attack & 1 in reserve. The two right hand guns were put out of action and the emplacements destroyed by shell fire. The disposition of the Battn after B Coy had moved up remained unchanged during the day. Heavy shelling continued during the day C6 C5 suffered severely also CTs from Crater to fire trenches, there were bombed in places and very little cover against shrapnel remained in the right sector. No definite information was received as to the result of the attack. It was believed that 2 Coys of the RIR had gone forward. In our original fire trenches now occupied by B Coy, Wilts, A Coy RIR and details of other regiments nothing was known as to the position in front and no communication was established with the Coys who had gone forward. The situation was very uncertain. Our troops on the left were observed to retire from the enemies trenches which had apparently been captured, it was reported by a Sgt that they lost heavily by M gun enfilade fire in doing so. Orders were received at 7.30p.m. for the Battn to relieve the RIR & 2 S Lincs who had come back to their original line. Two Coys of the Battn were eventually moved up into the firing line with 2 M guns of the 4th S Lincs to replace those put out of action. B Coy was relieved and sent back to dugouts at HALF WAY HOUSE. D & C Coys garrisoned the firing line with A in Support. Relief of RIR and 2nd S Lincs was completed at about 1.30a.m. The enemy continued to shell the CTs and approaches to front at intervals until 2a.m. The fire trenches especially on the right were found to be in a very demolished condition and the line in front practically destroyed and many dead were lying about, a large number of bombs were buried and others rendered unserviceable. The Battn at the end of the day consisted of 400 rifles the majority of whom were in a very exhausted condition. There had been very few opportunities of getting any sleep during the past week. Officers present with HQ on 25th:- Lieut Colonel W S Brown, 2nd Lieut/A Adj E T Peel, Lieut A Weston R A M C. A Coy: Capt S Ogilvie, 2nd Lieut Gosden, 2nd Lieut J T Snelgrove 2nd Lieut P E Petter B Coy: Capt Hales, (machine guns) 2nd Lieut Greece, 2nd Lieut Maybrook, 2nd Lieut Emanuel. C Coy: Capt R Knubley, Lieut G D Russell, 2nd Lieut Cartwright. D Coy: Capt A H Upton, Lieut H Webber, 2nd Lieut Terry. Casualties:- Officers:- 2nd Lieut Emanuel Killed Capt A H Upton Wounded Other Ranks:- 15 Killed, 53 Wounded. Points of Interest. 1. Value of assembly slits and new trenches dug overnight. B Coy suffered very few casualties in slits S of MENIN road, these trenches had apparently not been registered and were not under direct observation. The half of A Coy had only 1 casualty in the new trench dug during night to the rear of the existing one H12. The new trench was carefully concealed with turf and light head cover was constructed to afford protection from shrapnel and falling pieces of shell. This trench was never apparently observed. 2. Telephonic Communication was of no value. It would seem to be essential to establish some simple form of visual signalling between fire trenches and nearest supports. 3. The functions of CTs were registered points & were shelled during the day. This is not the most suitable place to post guards to direct movement up & down the trenches. Head cover should be erected for such posts. The majority of CT trench guards were killed. 4. The CTs though blown in in many places were used throughout the day and were of the utmost value for evacuating wounded and relieving congestion in the front lines. 5. The importance of all ranks knowing position of Battn HQ, much delay and possibly many casualties were occasioned by orderlies bringing messages to the wrong headquarters. 6. There did not appear to be much advantage in having a dressing station in so advanced & exposed position. Only walking cases could be dealt with during the day & such could well have been attended to further back. 7. Artillery slits off the CTs were of value in drawing and distributing the enemy's fire. A large quantity of ammunition was expended in the slits off CASTLE ST in front of F2. These were unoccupied. Dummy trenches & barricades on the Wed night might have been of considerable value in drawing the enemies fire from occupied trenches: if time had been available to construct them.

Pte Simeon Rowe aged 23, Royal Fusiliers (Bankers Battalion), youngest and dearly loved son of Mr and Mrs Simeon Rowe, Fowey, Cornwall. But what put glory of grace into all that they did, is that they did it of pure love for their country.

Wilts Times 30 December 1916

Former Swimming Club Secretary Killed.

Alderman and Mrs S Rowe, Fowey, Cornwall have received the sad news that their youngest son, Simeon was killed in action "in bravely resisting a heavy night attack of the enemy." He was attached to the Royal Fusiliers and assisted in the taking of Flers on September 15th, when he received a slight shrapnel wound in his leg. On that occasion, the GOC commended his Commanding Officer on having taken the most advanced position in the capture. Just prior to the fateful action of the 14th inst., he had been officially asked to take up a commission and was expected to home on leave early in the new year.

The chaplain of the Division writes " that he fought bravely and with great demeanour, he was always loyal to duty and ready to help a comrade; he was endeared to all who knew him and we shall all miss him". He was laid to rest in a small cemetery with the rites and prayers of the Church of England and his sorrowing comrades attending.

Pte S Rowe came to Chippenham about six and half years since, taking up a youth position in the Capital and Counties Bank. His duties were most satisfactorily performed and his progress a success. Later in his career he was invited to become the honorary secretary of the Swimming Club. His services, which put the club in a sound position, were appreciated by the committee and presented him with a wristlet watch on his leaving in January last to join up. He was a member of the Parish Church Choir.

Mr and Mrs Rowe have 4 other sons, one a prisoner since October 1914. A third son (civil service) who was severely wounded on July 2nd and is still in hospital. Another son (bank cashier) is serving in HM Navy and another is a checker in munitions work, having failed to pass for military service.

'A' coy in reserve in Scottish trench. 'A' Company had been kept intact, as it had orders to make a reconnaissance after the position had been captured, the reconnaissance to be on VIOLAINES. The firing line reached a point about 50 yards west of German trench at J14. There was then only one officer not hit in the two leading companies.</p> <p>At 7.5pm half 'A' company went forward to push on the the attack which had been held up. This half company with half 'D' company then advanced, and were subjected to enfilade fire from the crater, and could not advance beyond the disused Old German trench.</p> <p>At 9pm the situation was as follows:- The regiment was occupying the old German trench, with 'C' & 'D' Coys in front of them, and the trench J7 - I5, and were in touch with the Grenadier Guards on left of J7. Groups from 'C' & 'D' companies were returning to old German trench from the front. Orders were received to attack the German line at 9.15pm in conjunction with the Bedford Regt & Yorkshire Regt. The time was subsequently altered to 10pm in order to form up for the attack the companies which were holding the old German trench & were being enfiladed from the right were ordered back to Scottish trench with orders to form up in rear of it to clear the field of fire of the company holding J7 - I5. The order to attack was subsequently cancelled as far as the Regiment was concerned, and instructions were received to hand over the trenches to the Bedford Regt and return to WINDY CORNER.</p> <p>[continued from 15th] During the action of 15th 16th, the Germans used incendiary bullets, and also sniped the wounded in front of their trenches.</p>

<p>Belgium, Kemmel. In trenches. Left billets at LOCRE 2.45a.m. and marched via KEMMEL to the section of the trenches known as "F" in front of SPANBROEK MOLEN. The Battn arrived in position at dawn about 5.30a.m. and occupied four lines of trenches on the reverse side of the hill, the Worcestershire Regt being in similar trenches on our right. The BHQ were in the trench known as F2 about 50 yds in front of the front trench in which the Battn was situated: these trenches were about 25yds apart. The morning was dull and very misty, so that the Artillery bombardment which was to precede the assault on SPANBROEK MOLEN had to be delayed. The whole morning remained misty and except for a certain amount of sniping and desultory gun fire was quiet. At 1p.m. the mist began to clear and by 2.30p.m. it was clear and the Artillery bombardment began and continued with a slight pause till 4.10p.m. It consisted of field guns firing shrapnel to cut the hostile wire, and large quantities of heavy HE to beat down the German parapets and blow in his trenches, in this it appeared to be fairly successful, but, it was afterwards observed that the enemys front line trenches were almost intact. At 4.10 the Infantry assault was launched by 2 Coys of the Worcestershire Regt accompanied by a party of RE. The remaining 2 Coys being detailed as working parties. The front Coy (A Coy) rushed forward crossing the trench known as F2, by means of flying bridges, which had been placed in position early in the morning, and, passing through our barbed wire by means of gaps which had been made opposite the bridges: as soon as A Coy had got across the bridges the enemy opened a very heavy fire (rifle and machine gun) on them, and only a few small isolated parties succeeded in getting up to the enemys wire, a distance of about 200 yds. B Coy also came under a very heavy fire and were unable with the remainder of A Coy to get more than 50 yds from F2. At the same time most of the Worcestershire Regt on our right appeared to be also unable to get on. B Coy endeavoured to crawl forward, but, were unable to get very far, and gradually, starting about 5p.m. began to fall back into F2 suffering considerably in doing so. Most of the survivors of A Coy who were in advance of B Coy got back under cover of darkness. At about 7p.m., the Battn withdrew holding this position very strongly and did not seem unduly shaken by our Artillery fire. The 2nd SLancs Regt were in support and the Royal Irish Rifles in reserve at KEMMEL but neither took an active part in the action. A Coy was commanded by Capt P J V Viner Johnson and B Coy by Capt R H Broome. Throughout the day the trench known as F2 was held by the E Surrey Regt. FUNERAL OF PTE AJ SWANBOROUGH

The funeral took place at the cemetery on Thursday (15th April) afternoon of Pte AJ Swanborough, son of Mr Swanborough of Englands, Chippenham.

Deceased who belonged to the Gloucestershire Regiment and was 21 years of age went out to France in the early days of the war and was wounded at Mons, being shot through the lungs. He was sent back to England and was for a time in a London hospital and later in the Chippenham Cottage Hospital where he died.

Some comment was made on Thursday that the funeral was not recognised by the military authorities for although a short time before his death Pte Swanborough was discharged from the army as medically unfit for further service, his death was caused by the wound he received on the battlefield and he gave his life for his country.

The Reverend RA Ellis, Wesleyan Minister, officiated at the funeral and Alderman Bevan and Mr F Higgins attended as representatives of the Wesleyan Sunday School in which deceased had been a scholar. The wreaths included one from the nursing staff of the Chippenham Cottage Hospital and one from neighbours at Englands.

To the number of those who have thus crowned their service by sacrificing their lives must be added Trooper HA Tanner, the news of whose death has been received with great regret, and has drawn forth sympathy with the bereaved parents and members of his family.</p> <p>Trooper Tanner, who had only just passed his 21st birthday was the second son of Mr and Mrs FC Tanner of 73 Woodlane, Chippenham. As a boy he was a pupil at the Westmead School and was a member of the Church Lads Brigade and Boy Scouts, He showed considerable talent for sketching and painting and was an enthusiastic angler, being a member of the Chippenham Angling Club. He served his apprenticeship with Mr T Hamblyn, dentist, Chippenham and about eight months ago joined the Royal Wiltshire Yeomanry. Trooper Tanner came from a family of soldiers, being the grandson of Colour Sergeant F Blanchard of the 54th Northumberland Fusiliers and later of the permanent staff, Devizes. After service at Chippenham he was stationed at Tidworth and about Easter last, he was attached to D squadron, RWY and sent to France where he served some time at the base at Rouen. Later he moved nearer the firing line and wrote stating that he been through an interesting and exacting time under shrapnel. Later he had the misfortune to meet with an accident, being kicked by a horse. Serious complications ensued and he was removed to hospital and then sent back to Rouen. The doctors first hoped to be able to get him well but after a week in hospital he grew worse and the end came suddenly on August 14th. Deceased was buried the following day in the cemetery at Rouen and was accorded full military honours. Funeral of Second Lieutenant RAB Warrilow

The funeral took place on Saturday at St Paul's churchyard of Second Lieutenant RAB Warrilow RAF who as reported in our last was killed in a flying accident in connection with the aerodrome at Beaulieu, Southampton on 13th inst. The body was removed to Chippenham in the charge of Lt Keishaw and remained at the residence of the deceased's parents, Malmesbury Road. The coffin was of polished elm with oak plinths and brass furniture and was covered with the union jack. The remains were carried from the house to the church and thence to the grave by the following officers of the RAF: - Lts RH Kelly, G Stephenson, IILt TH Cowley, Lts CHG Nida, J Winterbourne and JL Bell. There was a guard of 20 NCO's and men in the charge of FS Harptain. The mourners included deceased's father and mother, Misses Hilda and Minnie Warrilow (sisters), Mr A Warrilow (brother) and there was a large attendance at the church. The Rev FG Walmsley officiated.

The youngest son (Ted) still serving in the RASC MT in France was telegraphed to, but up to the time of our report no answer had been received from him

France, Trenches Just at the moment the rations were arriving about 5.30am the Germans carried out a bomb attack along the trench. This attack drove back 'C' Coy and forced part of it into 'A' Coys trench. Unfortunately the end of 'A' Coys trench was uncovered by this attack the consequence of this was that a part of 'C' Coy were driven into the British trenches. Exactly what happened was not known at this time & it was believed that 'A' Coy had been captured. The German advance was easily stopped by 'D' Coy. 'C' Coy organized a new attack & made good progress assisted by the bombers of the 2 Yorks. But coming under heavy machine gun fire they were again driven back. These attacks were most unfortunate as they prevented the issue of water and rations. Still 'B' Coy got theirs & 'D' Coy got a rum issue.

9.30 am - The Borders made an attack which was soon stopped as it was started through some mistake an hour before the

artillery bombardment was timed to take place. This attack died away quickly.

10.30am - The artillery bombardment and about 10.15am a new bombing attack was started along the German trench. Unfortunately LT Morison who led the attack was killed at once and the attack never really started. So the CO organized another with 1/2 platoon of 'B' Coy and the bombers of the Grenadier Guards. The CO led them out & this time the attack was quite successful.

About 350 persons were captured by a mixed detachment chiefly Wilts. It was at this time the lost 'A' Coy were discovered in the British trench. So 'A' Coy was pushed forward to assist to hold the line. The CO went back to try and collect more men for the purpose so sent forward the remainder of 'B' Coy. The result was that at dusk this line nearly as far as 23-30 was held by a jumbled mass of Wilts, Gordons Warwicks & Scots Guards

Dr MS Wilson of Chippenham received a telegram on Wednesday (29 Sept) morning stating that his youngest son Capt Geoffrey Wilson of the Wilts was killed in action in France. The deceased was a popular man in Chippenham where his loss is deeply regretted. Capt Wilson was educated at Marlborough. He was promoted to the rank of Captain on the field for his gallantry in leading on the men when other officers had been killed.

France, Verquin Battn moved at 12.30am marched via LA BOURSE and SAILLY, arriving at a reserve line of trenches SE of NOYELLES at point L12 o 6.6 at about 3am. Bombardment became intense. At about 6am the attack was launched. Battn ordered to advance through VERMELLES up communication trench (CHAPEL ALLEY) to occupy front line at point G11 o 9.8. Capt King wounded. 2/Lt FH Friend assumed command of 'A' Coy. Following the advance of the 20th Brigade the Battalion occupies the front and support German lines. Lt Col BH Leatham DSO then gave orders for the Battn to advance in open order in direction of CITE ST ELIE keeping to the north of HULLUCH ROAD, our right flank connecting with the 2nd Bedfordshires left. The Battn advanced in the following order, 'B' Coy on the left Capt WM Geddes in command, 'A' Coy on right 2/Lt FH Friend in command, two platoons of each company leading, two platoons immediately behind, 'C' Coy in support, 'D' Coy in reserve, Major RMP Gillson in command of 'C' Coy, Capt EC Mudge in command of 'D' Coy, the whole were led by Major CG Forsyth, and experiencing extremely heavy rifle and machine gun fire from the front came to a line held very weakly by a mixture of 8th Devon & 2nd Borders. The trench contained 4 German field guns and ammunition. Our losses were heavy and included the following Officers casualties **Capt GMU Wilson**, 2/Lts CFB Hodgins JH Clarke WHG Durrant killed. Major RMP Gillson, 2nd Lt FH Friend wounded the latter seriously.

At dusk the Battn was relieved by the 9/Devonshire Regt and took up a new front at BRESLAU AVENUE our right resting

on the latter Regiment

The war diary records Capt Wilson as being killed on the 25 Sep 1915 but the official CWGC date of death is the next day.

Dr Wilson's Bereavement
Death of Third and Last Son

General and sincere sympathy is felt with Doctor and Mrs Wilson in the death of their eldest and last son, Captain Herbert Raymond Wilson, Indian Infantry who died of wounds January 9th in Mesopotamia.

His two younger brothers were killed in France in 1915 Captain Geoffrey MU Wilson Wiltshire Regiment (who was 20 years of age) on September 25th; and Captain Evelyn S Wilson, East Yorkshire Regiment September 29th.

Captain Herbert Raymond Wilson was born at Chippenham in September 1888 and was educated at St Peter's school, Weston Super Mare and Repton, where he gained an Open Army Class scholarship. Leaving Repton for Sandhurst with an Indian Army cadetship in 1907. For a year he attached to the Yorks and Lancashire Regiment at Quetta and was gazetted to one of the Mahratta Regiments early in 1909. He served in Tibet and North Assam with the Chinese Frontier Commission and was Political Agent to the Chief Commissioner of Assam, Sir Archibald Earle. Recalled to his regiment on the outbreak of the war, he was in some of the early fighting in Mesopotamia, but contracted typhoid and was invalided home for six months. He returned to India in March last year and went to the front in the October following.

Mrs Wilson is the commandant of the local Red Cross hospital and not withstanding the great sorrow which has fallen upon her, she remains at her post of duty in superintending the services of those who are tending the sick and wounded in our midst.
