**YATTON KEYNELL** is a parish and village, in the Northern division of the county, hundred, union and county court district of Chippenham, diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, archdeaconry of Bristol, and rural deanery of Malmesbury South, distant 4½ miles west-north-west from Chippenham, and 12 north-east from Bath. The church of St. Margaret is an ancient structure, about to be restored; it has a nave, chancel, and south aisle, with Perpendicular tower. The living is a rectory, value £520, in the gift of Broom Pinniger, Esq., and held by the Rev. Frederick Radclyffe Sidebottom, M.A. Here is a National school for boys and girls; also a small neat Baptist chapel. The soil is
